"...and they become one body."

IN MY EARLIER YEARS as a priest, I spent some considerable time working one day a week at the Office of the Tribunal in Parramatta. Most of my time was spent conducting interviews of people who were seeking an annulment of their marriage, along with interviewing former spouses and witnesses connected with the cases. Though the circumstances were usually quite sad and the interviewing process challenging, I gleaned a lot of information about the struggles many people have in their marriages and came to appreciate the complexities of human relationships at a deeper level than I had previously.



I don't feel that this qualifies me to speak about marriage at the same level as though who are living, or have lived, it. Nonetheless, it helps me to have some empathy for those whose marriages have not, for one reason or another, lived up to the ideal set forth by Jesus and the Church, made clear in this Sunday's Gospel in which Jesus expands upon the ideal set forth in our First Reading from Genesis.

Jesus' words today are spoken in response to yet another attempt by the legalistic Pharisees to trap Jesus, this time using the subject of divorce to highlight his perceived lack of religious orthodoxy. The outcome follows the familiar pattern of Jesus responding in an enigmatic manner and the Pharisees (presumably) walking away, flummoxed and defeated.

What Jesus does is shift the focus from the laws surrounding marriage to what he considers its central importance – the union of a man and a woman as a single entity. The laws surrounding marriage in the Church today, (over one hundred of them, in fact), can obscure the central purpose of the sacrament. As any deacon or priest will tell you, the sacrament with the most paperwork and complex procedural matters is the sacrament of marriage. The bureaucratic details, linked closely with the Church and civil laws, can easily dominate the preparation of a couple for marriage if we are not careful.

Clergy are expected to prepare a couple not only for the "big day", the wedding, but for what lay ahead, the marriage, or "marriage covenant" to be more accurate. By their union, the spouses are called to help one another to eternal salvation, (as all sacraments do), not forgetting, of course, their openness to children; the importance of these factors means that significant pastoral preparation needs to take place. With divorce rates for Catholics differing little from the general population, the Church mandates some preparation for the couple prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

Even with pastoral preparation, marriages sometimes break down irreparably, and these circumstances call upon us to have the same heart as Christ, a heart which shows compassion and love. As we witness repeatedly in the life of Jesus, though he espouses the highest of ideals, Jesus never condemns those who fail to live up to them. We are called to the same loving response, be it regarding marriage or another area of human existence.

For those reading this who may have experienced, or are currently experiencing marriage struggles, no matter the outcome, rest assured of the practical and prayerful support of the Church, particularly this parish. For those preparing for marriage, focus not only on the day of the wedding, important as that is, but pray for the strength, courage, compassion and Christ-like love that will be important for a long, successful and fruitful union.

October Parish Stewardship Focus: Stewardship - Prayer, Participation, Gratitude

The creation story reminds us of two key points. First, from the beginning, God entrusted the care of all creation to us. Second, the practice of stewardship has been present since the dawn of humanity. It's not a modern concept introduced by the Church, but a fundamental part of our relationship with God and his creation. Just as generations before us built and nurtured our Church, it is now our responsibility to continue this work for future generations.

While we often associate stewardship with financial donations, this is only a small part of a much larger teaching. Stewardship is rooted in prayer and gratitude for the gifts God has entrusted to each of us. True gratitude begins with prayer, and prayer leads to action—action that surprises us with where God calls us to serve.

Each one of us is created in the image of God, and we are all gifted in unique and profound ways. The challenge of being a good steward lies in identifying those gifts and using them to their fullest potential. Some gifts, like music, teaching, or leadership, are visible in the Church, but all of us have been richly blessed, even if our gifts aren't immediately obvious. Rest assured, God has not forgotten anyone—he has entrusted a gift to each of us.

During this month, we invite you to take time in prayer to discern the gifts God has given you and to consider how you can offer them in service to build his kingdom here on earth.

Prayer and Fasting for Peace: 07 October

On the anniversary of renewed conflict in the Middle East, Pope Francis has called for a day of prayer, fasting, and penance for peace in the world on 07 October, the one-year anniversary of the Hamas attack on Israel. During the opening Mass of the XVI General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, the Pope reminded us that, as Christians, we are called to announce the joy of the Gospel, especially in this time of war and violence. He will lead the Rosary at the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore, asking for the intercession of the Virgin Mary.

In unity with the Pope's intentions, we invite all parishioners to join Fr. Tom for an online Rosary on Monday 07 October, also the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary, or to offer Masses and pray the Rosary wherever they are, joining the global prayer for peace.

Additionally, Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv has suggested that all parishes, schools (when they return from school holidays), and agencies recite the following prayer during a liturgy, paraliturgical (such as the midday Angelus), or at the start of a group meeting throughout the month of October, or whenever deemed suitable.

Saint of the Week

11 October - St John XXIII (1881-1963), Pope

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was born in the village of Sotto il Monte, near Bergamo, in 1881. At the age of 11 he entered the seminary at Bergamo and later pursued his studies at the Pontifical Seminary in Rome. He was ordained priest in 1904. He was secretary to the Bishop of Bergamo but from 1921 onwards he served the Holy See directly in various posts, both in Rome and in Bulgaria, Turkey and Greece, culminating as Apostolic Nuncio to France from 1944 until 1953, when he was created cardinal and made the Patriarch of Venice. He was elected Pope in 1958. He convoked the Roman Synod, instituted the revision of Canon Law, and called the Second Vatican Council, which opened on 11 October 1962. He died while the Council was still in session, on the evening of 3 June 1963.

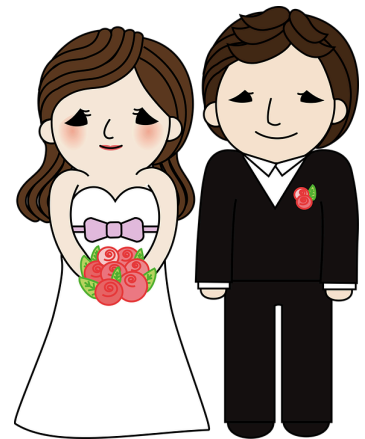

The Church usually only tests the validity of a marriage when a couple have divorced and one or both parties are seeking to marry again in the Catholic Church. The Church Tribunal, established in every Catholic diocese, will then undertake a process to determine if the marriage was valid when it was contracted. There are various reasons why a marriage may be invalid according to Church law.
