Christ the King

THERE CAN BE A DANGER in life of "one dimensionalising" a person, as though they are captured by just one aspect of their life or personality. This person is "this", or this person is "that". Whereas the reality is that each person has lots of dimensions to them depending on who it is that is relating to them. In my case, to my mum, I will always be her young son David - when I was 50 she was still asking me if I was eating enough, or did I not have a warmer jacket to wear. To my kids, I am Dad, the taxi driver, and now the banker. To my employees I am David the businessman, and in the Cathedral, I am Deacon Dave. Depending on what their relationship is to me, I am different things to different people. All of us are.



Jesus is just the same - based on their background and their experiences Jesus means different things to different people. To some people, Jesus is the shepherd with the lost sheep on his shoulders, or the father of the prodigal son. To some, he is the serving Jesus, kneeling and washing the feet of his disciples. To some he is the suffering Saviour dying for our sins. To some, he is the Risen Lord, full of grace and spirit. And Jesus is all of these.

Today, we celebrate another dimension of Jesus: Christ the King. The king of the universe. The Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. In today's gospel Jesus claims his kingship, and despite the fact that He knows he is on trial for His life, He claims his kingship with the strength and dignity of a true king: "Yes, I am a king. I was born for this. I came into the world for this."

How blessed are we! What an incredible king we have. If you think about all the leaders we see in the world today - how poor are they? They focus on themselves, their power, their interests. They are proud and egotistical. They are morally weak and they lack wisdom and compassion. And if we look back at history it has seldom, if ever, been very different. But just look at our king - a king who is gentle, compassionate, and humble. A king who is strong, courageous, and wise. A king who loves his people enough to die for them. How blessed are we!

Today Jesus tells us he came to bear witness to the truth. Our king is a king of truth and justice. A king who will bring love, peace and joy to the world. Today we celebrate that this king will come again into our world and bring God's reign to its fulfillment. Thanks to Him, one day the world will be exactly as it ought to be.

Today when we watch the priest lift up the Eucharist, the true presence of Jesus Christ, let us forget all the other images we have of Him, and today just focus on, and celebrate, Jesus Christ the king.

If you were told that an important person was going to visit your home, how would you prepare? The more important the person, the more time and care you would put into preparing to receive them. Today, as we approach the Eucharist let us prepare our hearts to receive a king, and not just any king, Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe.

21st Anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral - 29 November

Next Friday, 29th November, we will celebrate the 21st Anniversary of the Dedication of our Cathedral. This is a significant milestone in the life of our parish and Diocese.


From Pope Francis...

Saint of the Week

26 November - St John Berchmans (1599-1621)

John Berchmans was born in Diest, Belgium. He joined the Jesuit novitiate when he was seventeen. Sent to Rome to study philosophy at the Roman College in 1619, he surprised both masters and classmates: he joined an exquisite charity and friendliness to a brilliant intelligence and great emotional maturity. His spiritual diary also reveals the depth of his interior life, which bespeaks a true mystical union with God. His health suffered from the effort he put into studying for his final examination, and he became steadily weaker as he prepared for the disputation. On 08 July 1621, he passed his final examination brilliantly, but soon after he fell seriously ill with dysentery and died on 13 August 1621.

...that the Feast of Christ the King is a relatively recent addition to the Catholic liturgical calendar?

Wikipedia notes that this feast was "instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI for the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church. In 1970, its Roman Rite observance was moved from October to the last

Sunday of Ordinary Time and thus to the end of the liturgical year. The earliest date on which the Feast of Christ the King can occur is 20 November and the latest is 26 November."

What can you do to show Jesus that He is the king of your life? What can you do to show other people that Jesus is your king?






