Advent has arrived...

IN GENERAL, OUR CHRISTIAN LIFE is marked by seasons. We enter into one period of life, and changes happen which draw us into a new season. Always, the principles of Christian living remain throughout, though at times we can emphasise one aspect which especially helps us through a particular period. The liturgical seasons that we observe have this same character. They help us to focus on certain aspects of our faith that nevertheless remain throughout the year.



In this season of Advent, we focus our attention on Christ's coming. We are at once preparing ourselves to remember liturgically his Incarnation, his birth as man in the cave of Bethlehem, but also his Second Coming at the last day. The focus of our readings revolves around these themes then, but also emphasises the immediacy of his coming today. Our Collect this Sunday implores us to realise that it is through the good works that we perform now (not putting them off), that we demonstrate the resolve to run forth to meet him when he comes.

Likewise, in our Gospel, speaking of those last days when the heavens and the earth will be prepared for his coming again, Christ urges his disciples to "stay awake." It is by constantly asking him, "Lord, make me know your ways/Lord, teach me your paths," as we pray in the Psalm, and by "walking in [his] truth," that we now put on those righteous deeds of his and make ourselves ready to meet him.

Should we take heed of this message, we shouldn't fear those fateful things Christ prophesies in our gospel today. It is the godless, those who have not taken heed of his commands for who these warnings are principally directed. If we follow him and every day await his entry into our hearts by constant prayer and good deeds, then we have nothing to worry about. We will be able to "stand with confidence" before him when he does come, knowing the salvation he has worked in us, having come to know and to believe in his unfathomable mercy.

In this new season of Advent let us make use of the time given us to reflect on our lives that we may "make more and more progress in the kind of life [we] are meant to live" and so enjoy not only a fruitful Christmas, but also confident to meet the Son of Man face to face.



Saint of the Week

04 December - St John Damascene (c.675 -749). Priest. Doctor

John was born of a Christian family in Damascus. Being under Muslim rather than Byzantine rule, was able to write effective treatises attacking iconoclasm and attacking the emperor for supporting it. At about this time he retired to the monastery of Saint Sabas near Jerusalem, where he became a monk and was ordained. He died in the middle of the eighth century.

John wrote many theological treatises in a dangerously clear and accessible style which made the issues understandable even by nonexperts. His name was reviled and execrated by the imperial Iconoclast party even after his death. Sometimes known as "the last of the Church Fathers," he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Leo XIII in 1883.




