"...my favour rests on you."

BAPTISM IS THE FIRST SACRAMENT we receive as Christians. No other sacrament can be received until we have been baptised, making it foundational and fundamental to our membership of the Church. All mainstream Christian denominations recognise baptism as the point of entry into Christian life, whether it is celebrated early in life or later.

It is important to note that today's feast of The Baptism of the Lord does not occur in isolation. The manifestation of Jesus as the Anointed One at his baptism was not the only manifestation of Jesus in



this regard. Last weekend we celebrated the Solemnity of the Epiphany when the Magi came to do homage to the infant Jesus, signifying the truth that the Christ came to offer salvation to all. Next Sunday, though we are returning to Ordinary Time, we hear of the manifestation of Christ's divinity through his miracle of turning water into wine at the wedding at Cana. Though this Gospel is not given to us as a reading for a feast day, and we don't hear it every year, the miracle at Cana is regarded, along with the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord, as one of the three manifestations of Christ to the world as Saviour.

In recalling the baptism of Jesus by John, we are recalling more than a simple ceremony. When Jesus was baptised something remarkable occurred: his divinity was made manifest to the world, evident in the words that thunder from the heavens: "You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you." Let us not think however, that it was only at Jesus' baptism that something extraordinary happened.

I frequently use the Gospel of the baptism of Jesus when celebrating this very sacrament. I like to make the point that it is a very dramatic Gospel, with the heavens opening up, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the voice of the Father affirming Jesus' divine nature using the words quoted above.

I always mention that we are unlikely to witness the heavens opening up or the Holy Spirit descend upon the child here in the chapel as they did at the River Jordan nearly two thousand years ago! Yet something dramatic *does* happen in this sacrament, even if the celebration of the sacrament looks uneventful to an onlooker. Though we don't see the Holy Spirit descending on the one being baptised or hear the Father's voice from heaven, the Holy Spirit *does* descend on the child and the Father's favour *does* rest on them too. This being so, we can delight in the knowledge that all of us who have been baptised are filled with the Holy Spirit and are favoured by God.

It is not insignificant that Jesus asks to be baptised as he commences his public ministry. The affirmation he receives from his Father, along with the intimate presence of the Holy Spirit, means that he can approach all that is to come with peace of mind and openness of heart.

And so it is for us. We can live out our mission of spreading the Good News, safe in the knowledge that, like Jesus, we are gifted with the same Spirit and affirmed by the same heavenly Father.

And that is something surely worth celebrating and for which to give thanks.

I noted recently that some parishioners, especially on Saturday morning, are arriving very early for Mass, sometimes more than an hour before the scheduled start time for Mass.

Whilst this might not seem a problem, please note that the chapel is normally scheduled to open half an hour before Mass starts. This means that if you arrive early, you may have to wait outside. The parish **cannot** guarantee your health and safety under these circumstances. Should you have a fall or suffer a medical emergency, there may be no one around to assist you. Also, there is the possibility, however remote, of a vulnerable person being the victim of crime when alone around the cathedral precinct.

I urge all those who come to Mass here, on whatever day of the week, to arrive no more than half an hour before the first scheduled Mass of the day for the sake of their well being.

Saint of the Week

16 January - St Joseph Vaz (1651-1711), Priest and Missionary

Joseph Vaz was a missionary born on 21 April 1651 in Goa, India. He died on 16 January 1711 in Kandy, present day Sri Lanka. He was an Oratorian missionary priest. He arrived in Sri Lanka (formerly known as Ceylon) during the Dutch occupation.

The Dutch had expelled the Portuguese who had introduced Catholicism to Ceylon. The Dutch then went on to impose Calvinism as the official religion. Father Vaz travelled throughout the country, bringing the Eucharist and Sacraments to clandestine groups of Catholics. He would sometimes disguise himself as a beggar in order to facilitate his mission. Later, he founded a shelter in the Kingdom of Kandy where he intensified his missionary work of ministering to both the minority Tamil and Sinhalese ethnic groups. By the time of his death, he had managed to rebuild the Catholic Church in Ceylon. He was beatified by Pope Saint John Paul II on 21 January 1995, in the Sri Lankan capital, Colombo, and canonized there by Pope Francis on 14 January 2015.
