Going out into the deep

IF YOU GET the chance to look at the plaque on the stand behind the bishop's seat in our cathedral, you will see the Latin phrase "Duc in altum," the motto chosen by Bishop Vincent. This means "Put out into the deep," the words we hear Jesus speak in this Sunday's Gospel.



Putting the phrase into context, we encounter Jesus at the beginning of his ministry in Galilee. He has been baptised, spent forty days in the desert where he was tempted by the devil, rejected by his own people in the synagogue at Nazareth and effected a couple of healings, including the mother-in-law of Simon Peter. Jesus is today standing on the shore of the Sea of Galilee when he gets into an empty boat and asks Peter to row out a little from the shore so that he, Jesus, can teach the large numbers of people that have gathered. It is then that Jesus tells Peter to let down the nets into deeper water, with the remarkable result that ensued.

Perhaps the most surprising thing that happens is not the huge catch of fish but the response of Peter to it. One would have thought that he would thank Jesus profusely and hug him with joy and gratitude. Instead, Peter says, humbly, "Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man."

Peter clearly feels that, because he is a sinner, he is unworthy to stand in the presence of the Divine. Yet Jesus makes Peter the leader of the apostles, all of them sinners, and all of them given the responsibility to spread the Good News, to become now fishers of people, to catch vast numbers as symbolised in the recent catch of fish.

Putting out into the deep is what we are called to do as Christian missionaries too. We can feel, as Peter did initially, that we are unworthy, but we cannot remain in that space as it only leads to inactivity and failure.

Rather, we are called to take risks and be bold in our proclamation of the Gospel, however that may look for us. The apostles "left everything and followed Jesus" - risk-taking by any definition! Putting out into the deep means, amongst other things, putting aside our pre-conceived notions of who God is and opening our minds and hearts to new possibilities of living out the Gospel in our world today. This means not understanding the Gospel as a dead text with everything set in stone, but as an entity that is vibrant and seeking new and vital ways to be lived. This means being open to the challenges that our society poses, rather than seeking easy answers that allow us to make quick, pre-determined decisions which may alienate people and make them hostile to the message of life that Jesus embodies.

Yes, we are unworthy carriers of the Good News, like Peter and every other disciple of Jesus. But that should not mean that we are timid bearers of it. The fact that we are a redeemed people ought to make us bold in the proclamation of the Gospel, to do exactly as Jesus told Peter and the others to do - to put out into the deep.

Will you "put out into the deep"? What have you to fear?

Word of
God
Sunday

Brothers and sisters, on the Sunday devoted in a special way to the word of God, let us thank the Father for having spoken to us by his own Word, made flesh for the salvation of the world. All the Scriptures, which have human writers and the Holy Spirit as their true authors (cf. Dei Verbum, 11), point to this event. The whole Bible speaks of Christ and his work, which the Spirit makes present and active in our lives and in history. When we read the Scriptures, when we pray and study them, we do not simply receive information about God; we receive his Spirit, who reminds us of all that Jesus said and did (cf. Jn 14:26). In this way, our hearts, inflamed by faith, wait in hope for the coming of God. Brothers, sisters, we must become more familiar with reading the Scriptures. I would like to suggest that all of us get a small, pocket-sized copy of the Gospels or the New Testament. We could always have it with us in a bag so that we can read it at various points throughout the day. One verse, two verses so that throughout the day we will have contact with the Lord. A small copy of the Gospels is enough.

Let us respond with enthusiasm to the good news of Christ! For the Lord has not spoken to us as silent listeners, but as his witnesses, called to evangelise at all times and in every place. Today, forty brothers and sisters from various parts of the world have come to receive the ministry of Lector. Thank you! We are grateful to them and we pray for them. We are all praying for you. Let us commit ourselves to bringing the good news to the poor, proclaiming release to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, letting the oppressed go free and announcing the year of the Lord's favour. Then yes, sisters and brothers, we will transform the world in accordance with the will of God, who created it and redeemed it in his immense love. Thank you!

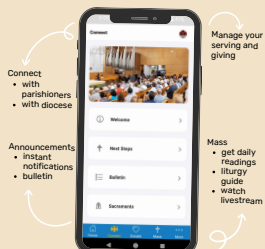

Saint of the Week

13 February - Blessed Jordan of Saxony (c.1185-1237), Priest

Blessed Jordan was born at Burgberg, Westphalia, around the year 1185. While studying in Paris he was attracted to the Dominican Order by Blessed Reginald and received the habit from him in 1220. On the death of Saint Dominic the friars elected him Master of the Order. For fifteen years he ministered to his brothers and sisters by his preaching, his letters, his edition of the Constitutions, his frequent visitations and the example of his life. More than one thousand novices were attracted to the Order during the tenure of his office. He directed Blessed Diana and her community in the way of perfection and governed all his subjects with gentleness and kindness. His love for Mary, the Mother of God, expressed itself by his decree that the Salve Regina was to be sung after compline. Blessed Jordan was shipwrecked and drowned on 13 February 1237.
