"...no one will ever steal them from me."

THE FOURTH SUNDAY of Easter is often referred to as "Good Shepherd Sunday" because, regardless of the year, we always hear an excerpt from the tenth chapter of John's Gospel, much of which is focused on the imagery of a shepherd caring for his flock. On only one Sunday in the three-year cycle of the lectionary do we hear Jesus calling himself the "Good Shepherd" but his love for his people, as a shepherd for his sheep, is evident in what we hear in the Gospel every year on this Sunday.



A shepherd is concerned with not only ensuring that the sheep have enough good pasture for grazing and access to clean water, but also that they are

safe from predators, undoubtedly a concern for shepherds in times when there were no enclosures or modern weaponry for defence. Shepherds were concerned with not only animal predators seeking to harm sheep but also, one imagines, people seeking to steal the sheep.

In this context, the words of Jesus in today's short Gospel, are comforting. In summary, Jesus knows us intimately, we are given eternal life, we will never be lost, nor will we be stolen from Jesus. Yet, as we hear at the beginning of today's Gospel, this is dependent upon us listening to Jesus' voice. Though we cannot be "stolen" from Jesus' flock, this does not preclude us from leaving the flock of the Church of our own accord. We are given the gift of free will and can exercise it as we please, though there are consequences for the choices we make.

I would think that very few people actually make a conscious choice to leave the Church. I am not saying it is unknown, but I believe that many people who are no longer active in their faith have simply drifted away. It is an insidious process, not limited to matters of faith, of course. We miss a Sunday Mass, either through choice or, more likely, through circumstances beyond our control, and whilst initially feeling bad about it, the busyness of our lives pushes that feeling to the back of our minds and then one missed Mass becomes another, and another, and so on. Before long, other aspects of an active faith are abandoned and one's former life, noteworthy for its Christian character, is now indistinguishable from the lives of others. We have not hearkened to the voice of the Shepherd.

This calls for vigilance on our part. We need to regularly look at our faith lives and ask ourselves how close we are to Christ. What is the health of my prayer-life? Am I engaged when I am at Mass? How are my relationships looking? Do I have care for those in need? Is my faith life evident to others? Does it bear fruit?

If we believe that we have moved away from Christ, we need not be afraid to reverse that movement. Christ is always there waiting for us to turn towards him once again.

Let us ensure that we do what we can to stay close to Christ, the Good Shepherd. May we heed his words today: "The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice; I know them and they follow me."
