Do you love me...?

WE CONTINUE TO meditate upon the mysterious appearances of Jesus to his disciples after he rose from the dead. This week, the disciples appear to be in a state of limbo, as they have seen the Lord at least twice now, but don't really know what to do about it. John paints us a beautiful scene of the real humanity of the disciples. Peter, ever on the front foot, decides to return to his old occupation of fishing, seemingly restless, not caring to simply wait around. The others follow along apparently without a better idea. We can see the Beloved Disciple's eyes



widen and his heart beat firmer as he recognises the risen Lord on the shore while they're fishing. And at this, Peter throws himself into the water, wading hurriedly through to see his Master. They then sit down with Jesus and have a meal.

It's in this context that Jesus renews his call to Peter to be the shepherd of his flock. After having rejected the Lord three times during his ordeal, Peter is given the opportunity three times to cover over his sin with love. In this way, Jesus shows Peter that what he is being called to is to give himself to Jesus in love, to love the Lord above all, and loving thus, look after Christ's own.

Peter wasn't perfect. As the gospels portray, he was all too human. A man like any other, with his strengths and weaknesses, with his triumphs and failures. Yet it is he that Jesus chose to lead his Church. Christ places before Peter his guiding post – love. A love that would drive him to tend to the sheep, to nourish them and care for them even unto the point of death, loving with the same love that Christ did. All of Peter's strengths and his weaknesses could be integrated by love and used somehow by the Lord for the good of his flock. To love Jesus more than these is the essential ingredient.

And it is this that we must keep in mind as we pray for the next pope. Each of the cardinals are mere men like Peter with their strengths and weaknesses, with their triumphs and their failures as bishops and as men. None of them are perfect. Yet what will matter most is that the man they elect will be a man who is willing to leave all for the sake of love. A man who can say with Peter to Jesus, that yes, I love you more than these. What will matter most is whether the man elected will be willing to love with the same love that Jesus showed by dying on the cross. Whether he will be willing to accept the loss of all in order to ensure that Christ's own are tended to in the manner that Christ would tend to them. So, pray for the cardinals, that their decision will not be based on politics or agendas, but on the one thing that seemed to matter most to Christ when he chose the first pope: love.

Experience an evening of breathtaking sacred music in the stunning surrounds of St Patrick's Cathedral.





Saint of the Week

05 May - Blessed Edmund Rice (1762 - 1844), Founder

Following the death of his wife in 1789, he devoted himself to prayer and good works, in particular to the education of the poor in his home town of Waterford: the children being taught were so poor that they needed to be clothed and fed as well. He founded schools, and undertook the training of teachers. In 1808 he and six companions took religious vows. This was the nucleus of the Presentation Brothers, who continue to this day. The Christian Brothers share the same root: the two congregations separated in the 1820s.

...that the conclave to elect the successor to Pope Francis is scheduled to begin this coming Wednesday, 07 May?

The ABC News website notes: "There are currently 252 cardinals worldwide. The preparatory meetings they have daily during the interregnum are collectively known as the General Congregation. Of the total number of cardinals, 135 are eligible to enter the

conclave as cardinal electors. This will be the largest number of cardinals to participate in a conclave."
