The Most Holy Mystery

AS MOST OF YOU would be aware, Fr Tom, Deacon David and I take turns to write the reflection for the front of the bulletin each week. A few weeks ago, there was a bit of a hiccup in the system, with the result that it fell to me to write the reflection this week for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, a prospect I didn't relish!

Why? Because the Trinity is a truth, the fullness of which is beyond human understanding, so writing about it is hardly going to be an easy exercise. Yet, the fact that the Trinity, the true nature of God, is a mystery is, in a way attractive, because it invites us to ponder who God is for us, a God who is not able to be defined, boxed up and mastered, to be used for our benefit like a tool. Were the nature of God to be something we could understand, define and categorise like a plant or an animal, we would not have faith, we would have science.

Speaking of which, in this scientific age when we can examine nature down to a molecular level, there is a desire for certainty with almost everything we encounter, and this can easily extend to a desire to understand God in the same way. Whilst there is nothing wrong with this desire, (think of the scholastic theology of St Thomas Aquinas which dominated theology and seminary formation for hundreds of years), focusing only on this level of understanding of the nature of God may blind us to fruitful alternatives.

Though, as mere human beings, we cannot know God fully, we nonetheless get glimpses of God here and now. These glimpses can give us encouragement during our earthly pilgrimage, reminding us of God's reality and loving care and concern for us. These occasional "liftings of the veil" may come in the form of a simple awareness of the closeness of God during a time of prayer or a walk in the bush, or a more tangible situation such as spending time with someone we love. Of course, the possibilities here are limitless, but will only become manifest to us as much as we open ourselves to God's presence and all God wants to do with us.

So, let us give thanks to God that God is indeed unknowable in fullness, giving us the joyful task throughout our earthly pilgrimage of striving to know God more fully, open to all the opportunities that are presented to us in this regard, helping us to know that God is not simply something to be studied academically but to be encountered each day, if only we are seeking God and are attuned to God's presence, often in the unexpected.

It is good to understand this truth, for just when we think we have a more concrete understanding of God, God disappears and pops up again somewhere else looking remarkably unfamiliar. Thinking we can know the fullness of God is as pointless as trying to catch the wind with our hands.

Yes, the true nature of God is as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Our task as Christians is to take that truth to others, not academically, but practically, as did Christ himself.

Saint of the Week

19 June - St Romuald (c.951 - 1027), Abbot

Romuald joined a Benedictine monastery but made himself unpopular there by trying to get the lax monks to mend their ways and so, with the permission of his abbot, became a wandering hermit. In a constant fight against the degenerate monasteries of the day, he founded hermitages and monasteries where a life of prayerful solitude could be truly lived. The monastery at Camaldoli, which he founded and where he remained as abbot for a number of years, became the first house of an order of hermits which still exists. But Romuald took to his wanderings once more, and died in a monastery he himself had founded at Val di Castro – as he wished, alone in his cell.

Did You Know...?

...that many heresies within the Church revolve around the nature of God as a trinity?

In the early centuries of the Christian faith, the Church was struggling to establish its doctrine on the nature of God. Many understandings were proposed but rejected by the Church, though some still held to these false beliefs. For example, some held the view that the Son was not equal to the Father, that he was of a different “substance” to the Father. Known as Arianism, this heresy was one of the most widely held false beliefs in Church history, and still persists in some churches not in communion with Rome.
