Staring into the sky

BEFORE JESUS was taken into heaven, he tells the disciples that it is not for them to know times or seasons, yet after he disappears from their sight, they stand there gazing into the heavens. Maybe they were dumfounded by what they had just seen, or maybe they were expecting his immediate return. Whatever the case, they are reminded by the angels of the command of the Lord and to get on with the work he entrusted to them.



Why are you gazing into heaven? It is a perennial temptation that we want to know what's going to happen. This is often the case in our own lives when we try to control outcomes or seek from the Lord assurances about this or that. This is deeply rooted in our fallen nature, stemming from the original temptation to grasp at knowledge not given to us by the Lord. In a similar way that we see the disciples grasping after what is not for them to know, there are often movements within the Church which claim to know exactly that, predicting times and seasons. Beware of these. Christ is the definitive Revelation of the Father and so, in a way, there is nothing more to be said. We are given everything we need to know in him and about those things which are to come we must in humility leave that for the Lord.

After he ascended, the angels remind them of Jesus' instructions, to go and bear witness to him throughout the world, and to baptise in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, with the assurance that he will come again. Our task between the advents of the Lord is to make him known. We know that Jesus will come again and restore us in the resurrection, but until then he expects from us his followers to witness to his saving power by our words and deeds, not to worry about when or how things will turn out.

But we can only do this by the power of his Holy Spirit. At Pentecost which we celebrate next week, we are reminded of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles which set them ablaze to go and fulfil this very task. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit might similarly descend upon us too so that we may remain faithful to the mission entrusted to us by the Lord and be ever more fully conformed to him who will come again.

Saint of the Week

04 June - St Clotilde (475 - 545), Princess

Clotilde was a Burgundian princess who in about 493 married Clovis, King of the Franks. Brought up a Christian, she had their children baptised, and in due course Clovis himself was baptised, somewhere between 496 and 499, marking the beginning of Christian France.

When Clovis died in 511, and especially after her son Clodomir died in 524, Clotilde devoted herself to works of charity and founded many churches and religious institutions, setting a pattern that was later followed by many royal widows in Europe. She herself died by the tomb of St Martin of Tours in 545.


