Great Expectations

SO FEW THINGS ever meet our expectations – whether it's Christmas, or a birthday party, or even a holiday... so often the idea that we had, our image of how it would be, is way better than what actually happens. The bigger the build-up, the greater the let-down. Imagine what the build-up was like for the disciples – They had big expectations while they had travelled around with Jesus during His public ministry. He was the Messiah, and they were pretty sure He was going to lead the Jewish nation to freedom and they would be His key people. That idea will have taken a pretty big hit when Jesus was crucified, but then the Risen Lord began appearing and once again their expectations were enlivened and invigorated. In last week's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, just before Christ's Ascension, they were still asking Him: *'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?'* Jesus did not set them fully straight. He knew that they could not yet understand what He was really about, but when He told them that the Father would be sending them the Holy Spirit and that they would "receive power" when the Holy Spirit would come upon them, it must have added fuel to the fire.



So, when the Holy Spirit did actually come upon them at Pentecost, was it a huge anticlimax? I mean, they will have realised at that moment that Jesus's mission was not a political or military mission. He was not going to help Israel break free from Roman oppression, and they were not going to be powerful political figures. In fact, they may well have begun to understand that not only would they not be powerful in any human sense but they may well be vilified or persecuted by the people around them. So, did it all go terribly flat? Well, no, it was the absolute opposite. What Jesus had in mind for them was so much more than anything they had previously imagined. They would be spiritually powerful, and their lives would have immense impact on the world. They would play a significant role in Christ's mission to change the world, and save souls! They went from hiding in a locked room, to preaching publicly in the streets. They had experienced many Pentecosts, but this Pentecost changed their lives entirely.

So, what about us? What will this Pentecost mean for us? Will it be just another Solemnity with a lovely liturgy? Well, maybe, but it doesn't have to be. In fact, if you want, it could be life-changing...

This weekend, at all our Masses, there will be people talking about a program called Alpha. Alpha is a remarkable program that has been running for almost fifty years. Each year more than one million people attend one of these programs somewhere in the world. It has brought many people into their faith, or deeper into their faith. It's a program with good food, good company, and good questions to ponder and discuss. It gives us a very different, exciting, welcoming experience of what Church can be like. It deepens our relationships within our parish, and often leads people to an experience of the Holy Spirit that they have never had before. I don't like to build up people's expectations, but if you give it a go, I really don't think you'll be disappointed.





The SEVEN GIFTS of the Holy Spirit

Fear of the Lord: With this gift the Christian becomes keenly aware of anything that may hurt his/her relationship with God. There is a holy “fear” of hurting this relationship and grace is given to avoid these things at all cost.

Wisdom: With this gift the Christian is given a special grace to “ponder divine realities” in his/her speculative reason. We are able to see the big picture and know how best to be an instrument of peace and harmony in our world.

Understanding: This is the ability to have a supernatural assurance of the matters of faith. Life makes sense. We can make sense of the deeper parts of revelation, make sense of suffering and understand those things that tempt us to doubt. With this gift we come to see how everything in life can work for good in accordance with God’s plan.

Knowledge: With this gift the Christian knows, more in the practical intellect, what God’s will is in this or that situation. We know how to live, how to discern God’s will and what decision to make in our daily life. It also enables us to learn from our past mistakes.

Counsel: With this gift the Christian sees him/herself as a link in a chain which makes up the entire Church. God uses each one of us to help and support one another on our journey. We know what to say and how to act so as to do our part to build up one another.

Fortitude: Simply put, it is a firmness of mind and spirit to do good and avoid evil. It’s a sort of Christian courage. The Gospel will call all of us to a radical life of love. Fortitude gives us the strength we need to follow through.

Piety: This gift enables us to first reverence and love God, but also to see the dignity of one another and reverence each other as children of God.

Saints of the Week

12 June - Blessed Alphonsus Mazurek (1891-1944) and Companions, Martyrs

Alphonsus was born in 1891 at Baranowka, near Lubartow, Poland. He entered the Order of Discalced Carmelites in 1908, taking the religious name Alphonsus Mary of the Holy Spirit. He was ordained a priest and appointed as a professor, while dedicating himself to the education of youth. Afterwards he served in his Order as prior and bursar. In 1944, after having been arrested by the troops that had invaded his country, he was shot on 28 August at Nawojowa Gora, near Krzeszowice. He was beatified by John Paul II on 13th June 1999, together with many other Polish martyrs.

Did You Know...?

...that the Holy Spirit is sometimes referred to as the “Paraclete”, a Greek word meaning Advocate or Consoler?



The Holy Spirit gifts us in many different ways. The Catechism speaks of the manner in which it cleanses us of sin, compels us towards unity, converts us, helps and sustains faith, intercedes for us, leads believers to the truth, is the author of sacred scripture, and is the source of all holiness. Jesus referred to the Holy Spirit as the Advocate or Paraclete, meaning “he who is called to one’s side.”


Pentecost Sunday

Today is the feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came to Mary and the Apostles in the form of wind and tongues of fire.

Pray to the Holy Spirit every day to help you to do everything for God. Then see how your life changes!




