"...a peace the world cannot give..."

CONTRARY TO THE belief of some, Jesus did not have any desire to create a new religion. He came to offer salvation to all, but this required a new way of thinking and living, a new covenant, not an outright rejection of Judaism. Certainly, Jesus had issues with the way many of the religious authorities lived and promoted Judaism but, as a Jew himself, Jesus never stated that adherents of Judaism should reject the faith and the Law in order to be his disciples.

Of course, as things turned out, a new religion named after the Anointed One, the Christ, did emerge in the first couple of centuries after Jesus'



resurrection, but it came about organically. There was no particular moment in time when a leading disciple declared that Christianity was being instituted as a new faith and all those wanting salvation must adhere to the new faith known as Christianity. The early days of the Church were characterised by all sorts of issues: the extent to which Jewish worship was still necessary, the shape of the Eucharistic celebration, the place of women and children, baptismal practice, repsonse to persecution, and many other issues, including that of how non-Jewish (Gentile) people were to be admitted into the faith. It is this issue with which the apostles and elders are faced in this Sunday's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

This incident demonstrates that from its very beginning the Church has been confronted with conflict and, despite periods of relative peace, it has never known a time of without being under attack of one kind or another.

This makes the words of Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel sound rather hollow "Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you." These words are pronounced by Jesus in his final discourse to his gathered disciples before his crucifixion, occupying chapters 14-17 of John's Gospel.

Of course, Jesus never uttered hollow words. He qualifies his words when he states that the peace he gifts his disciples is "a peace the world cannot give." When we think of a "worldly peace" we think of an absence of conflict and suffering, a period of serenity and calm, a time to be savoured before the arrival of the next onslaught, whatever form it takes. The peace Jesus offers us is different: it is a peace which pervades our being *despite* the conflicts and unrest which assail us. It is a peace that enabled the apostles and other martyrs to be courageous and trusting of God when enduring unimaginable pain and staring death in the face; it is a peace which we experience too when we acknowledge that God is present to us in a very real and loving way, even when we are experiencing turmoil of one sort or another. This peace is what enables us to persist in difficult circumstances when we might otherwise give up and abandon ourselves to despair.

Let us savour the peace with which Christ graces us, make it evident to others and fulfil our obligation to work for peace in our world, that we may have at least a glimpse of the kingdom to come.

Saint of the Week

26 May - St Philip Neri (1515 - 1595), Priest

Philip was born in Florence in 1515. At the age of eighteen he went to Rome, and earned his living as a tutor. He undertook much-needed charitable work among the young men of the city, and started a brotherhood to help the sick poor and pilgrims.

He was advised that he could do more good as a priest, and was ordained in 1551. He built an oratory over the church of San Girolamo, where he invented services, consisting of spiritual readings and hymns, which were the origin of the oratorio (tradition is a good thing; but innovation also has its place). He continued to serve the young men of Rome, rich and poor alike, with religious discussions and by organising charitable enterprises. He had a particular care for the young students at the English College in Rome, studying for a missionary life and probable martyrdom in England.

He inspired other clergy to emulate him, and formed them into the Congregation of the Oratory. Oratorian foundations still flourish in many countries today. He died in Rome in 1595.



Did You Know...?

...that chapters 14 - 17 of John's Gospel constitute what is referred to as the "farewell discourse" of Jesus?

Actually, this discourse begins just before the end of chapter 13 at verse 31, which we read last weekend, in which Jesus gives the "new commandment". Jesus refers to the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, in this speech, and

also speaks of himself as the vine to which his disciples must be attached. After Jesus reassures his disciples he prays for them to the Father, a prayer which occupies all of chapter 17.
