"There is no need to be afraid, little flock..."

LAST WEEKEND, you might remember, we were presented with the Gospel concerning the pointlessness of hoarding wealth, underlined by the parable of the rich man who, on having a good harvest, decided to build bigger barns to accommodate the bumper crop, only to die that very night. His harvest, along with his other wealth, went to someone else.

The question that presents itself is: what was the motive behind the rich man's actions? Greed immediately springs to mind, but I think there is more to it than that. Behind greed often lies fear: fear, in this case, that his wealth will otherwise decrease and he will be left with nothing. Such an attitude, of course, means that there is no trust in God's providence and a heart hardened by fear and greed is unlikely to soften and open up to all that God offers. This is a cycle that is difficult to break.

Between last Sunday's Gospel and the one we hear this weekend, we hear Jesus telling his disciples not to worry about the essentials for daily living, making the point that if God takes care even of the flowers of the field, how much more will he take care of us?

And so, we come to today's Gospel with the very touching opening words, "There is no need to be afraid, little flock...". And why? "...for it has pleased your Father to give you the kingdom." What follows, a commandment and a parable, illustrates what our response should be to this precious gift of the kingdom, that is, the hope that comes with a relationship with Jesus, the one who is the embodiment of the kingdom of God.

In this Jubilee Year of Hope, let us understand that hope is what underpins our faith in a way that influences all that we do, to say nothing of love. If we truly believe that our relationship with Christ is based on the hope he promises us by his Resurrection, then we need have no fear for the future. Our lives will be infused with hope, and our relationships will be characterised by an inner love and joy, allowed to shine through us because our relationship with Christ is not impeded by fear. We hear in scripture: "...those who fear are not perfected in love." (1 John 4:18)

Of course, for most of us this is a lifelong struggle. Today's parable is one in which we may like to think that we are like the servant always ready for the return of our Master, yet we need to ask ourselves if our readiness, our "good behaviour" is motivated by a fear of punishment for doing wrong, or if we are genuinely ready because our behaviour reflects the inner joy and love that ought to characterise the demeanour and very being of the Christian disciple.

Fear is both a great motivator, in the short term, and a great hindrance in the long term. Fear reflects a lack of faith in the providence of our Creator and Father, something which we only truly appreciate when, as the adage goes, we "let go and let God."

Commemoration of the 1700th Anniversary of the Council of Nicaea

In 2025, the Church commemorates the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, where the foundational Nicene Creed was first formulated, affirming the divinity of Christ and the unity of the Trinity. As part of this historic occasion, the 11:00am Solemn Mass on 24 August will be celebrated by Bishop Vincent, and will feature a reflective performance by the cathedral choir of the 'Credo' from the Missa Papae Marcelli, by Palestrina, whose 500th anniversary of birth also occurs this year. Palestrina's sublime musical polyphony, echoing the theological clarity of Nicaea, offers a timeless musical meditation on the Creed's enduring truths, enabling worshippers to reflect more deeply on the Church's ancient profession of faith.

Saint of the Week

12 August - Blessed Isidore Bakanja (c.1886 - 1909), Martyr

Born in the Belgian Congo around the year 1886, Isidore was baptised on 06 May 1906 after receiving instruction from Trappists missionaries. Rosary in hand, he used any chance to share his faith; though he was untrained, many considered him as a catechist. He left his native village because there were no fellow-Christians there.

He then worked as a domestic on a Belgian rubber plantation. Many of the Belgian agents were atheists, who hated missionaries due to their fight for native rights and justice. Isidore encountered their hatred when he asked leave to go home. The agents refused, and he was ordered to stop teaching fellow workers how to pray. He was told to discard his Carmelite scapular, and when he did not, he was flogged twice. The second time, the agent tore the scapular from Isidore's neck, had him pinned to the ground, and then beaten with over 100 blows with a whip of elephant hide with nails on the end. He was then chained to a single spot 24 hours a day.

When an inspector came to the plantation, Isidore was sent to another village so that he would not be seen. The inspector took Isidore home to heal, but Isidore knew better. "If you see my mother, or if you go to the judge, or if you meet a priest, tell them that I am dying because I am a Christian."

Two missionaries who spent several days with him reported that he devoutly received the last sacraments. The missionaries urged Isidore to forgive the agent; he assured them that he already had. "I shall pray for him. When I am in heaven, I shall pray for him very much." After six months of prayer and suffering, he died on 15 August 1909, rosary in hand and scapular around his neck.

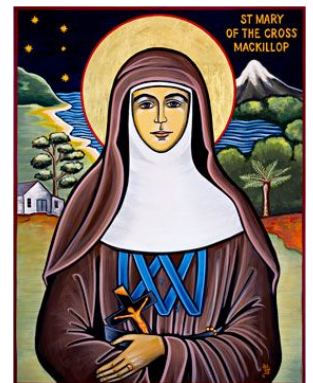

Did You Know...?

...that St Mary of the Cross MacKillop is Australia's first canonised saint?

Mary MacKillop was beatified (declared blessed) by Pope John Paul II in January 1995 during a ceremony in Sydney, and was canonised by Pope Benedict XVI on 17 October 2010 at St Peter's, Rome. Despite this, the process to have her declared a saint began in the 1920s. Her shrine is located in Mount Street, North Sydney. Though the first Australian to be declared a saint, causes for other Australians currently before the Pope include Sr Mary Glowrey, an Australian doctor who worked in India in the early 20th century.

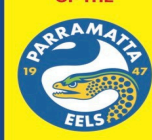
