The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

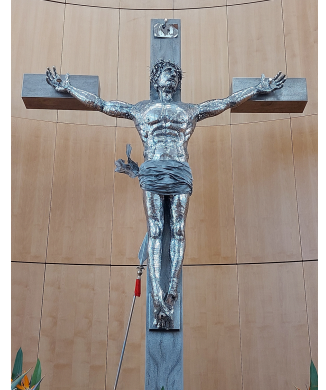
SOMETIMES the very same event can be understood in two very different ways. Our Church takes that view of Christ's Crucifixion on the Cross – there are two very different ways that we can look upon what happened and so the Church gives us two separate days to reflect on the Cross, each one with its own focus.

The first is, of course, Good Friday, when we typically focus on the physical human suffering – the terrible price that Christ paid for our salvation. That is entirely appropriate as we journey with Christ through His passion. When we reach Easter Sunday we tend to see the victory in the empty tomb. But that victory had been won on the Cross. Now Good Friday is not the time to focus on that victory so this week is the week that we focus on the spiritual consequences of the Cross – Christ's victory over sin and death, a victory that should draw us into praise and worship.

The first reading describes an Old Testament scene when the Israelite camp had been infested with deadly snakes. Moses mounted a bronze serpent on a pole and anyone who had been bitten by the snakes and looked upon that serpent with faith did not die. The physical healing granted through the serpent lifted up on the pole foreshadowed the spiritual healing that would be granted through faith in Christ, lifted up on the cross. Every person is afflicted by sin and death, but those who look to Christ in faith, are set free spiritually from both sin and death. Sin imprisons people in behaviours that drain the life out of them. And if you have ever attended the funeral of a non-Christian, you get a sense of the terrible finality that they face in death. What an incredible prize Christ has won for us! This Sunday we celebrate that victory, and as we contemplate what Christ achieved, we should be moved to praise and worship.

In most churches, the crucifixes portray the human, physical, suffering Christ on the cross, but at St Patrick's Cathedral we have been given a very different portrayal – here we see in a beautiful physical way, the victory of the Cross. We see the spiritual Christ, strong and powerful, His body already ascending to His Father. The Cross as a place of victory. Surely, we cannot look upon this image and not be drawn into praise and worship of Christ as the victor, our liberator. This depiction of Christ on the Cross is so appropriate for this week – you could almost feel that it was designed to encourage a real Exaltation of the Cross.

This week maybe take some time to come and gaze upon this cross. Look at this Christ, this strong, powerful, victorious Christ. As you gaze, reflect upon the freedom His victory has won for us - freedom from sin, freedom from death. Our second reading tells us that every being in the heavens, on the earth, and under the earth should bend the knee at the name of Jesus, so, as you gaze and reflect on Christ, do not be afraid to drop to your knees. Exaltation means to lift up, to glorify. Whether it is on our knees or in our hearts, this week let us answer the call of our God, through our Church, to glorify the Cross as the place of Christ's remarkable victory.

Saint of the Week

18 September - St Stanisław Kostka (1550 - 1568), Jesuit novice

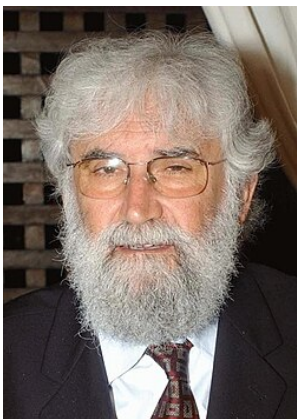
Stanisław Kostka (1550-1568) was born into a noble family in Poland. In 1567 he was sent to the Jesuit college in Vienna to complete his studies. Soon after, he expressed the desire to enter the Society of Jesus. The local Jesuit authorities, fearing the negative reaction of his father, hesitated to receive him. Stanisław, quickly grasping the difficulty raised by the opposition of his family, walked the 500 miles to Germany, from where with the encouragement and blessing of Saint Peter Canisius, the provincial superior, he went on to Rome. He was admitted to the Society of Jesus there. In the novitiate, Stanisław was blessed with mystical experiences. He died of illness on August 15, 1568.

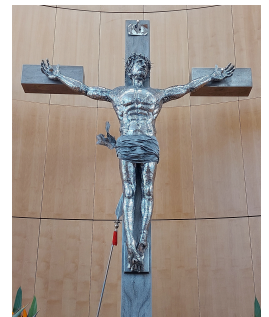

Did You Know...?

...that the crucifix in St Patrick’s Cathedral was designed with a specific brief attached to it?

Artist Robin Blau, who was tasked with much of the design work for the cathedral, was asked to create a crucifix with an image of Christ that was alive, not with the slack limbs of the dead Christ. He was also told that the image could be abstract in form but that it should still be recognisable. He was told that the image of Christ should evoke an “empathy with an within” parishioners and should address the question of what a 21st century Christ on the Cross should be.
