"I have a cunning plan..."

WHAT A CHALLENGING image of Jesus the Evangelist Luke has been presenting to us of late! Over the past few Sundays we've heard Jesus inform us that he has come to bring not peace but division to the earth and that if we are to be his disciples we are to hate those people closest to us. This weekend is no exception as Jesus appears to be condoning dishonest behaviour on the part of a steward. Once again, however, we can be certain that all is not what it seems on the surface.



You have often heard me emphasise the importance of doing a little research on the scriptures in order to

appreciate their true meaning and so benefit the most from contemplation of God's word. This weekend is a prime example of the necessity of this approach.

Fr Francis Moloney SDB, an Australian biblical scholar, explains that it was against the Law of Moses for interest to be charged on loans. In order to profit from making a loan therefore, the one who made the loan would simply demand a greater amount back than what was loaned in the first place, technically not charging interest because it was not "official". In today's Gospel, for example, the master had written that he was owed a hundred measures of oil when he had only given fifty to the debtor. No interest, as such, is being charged but the one making the loan was profiting greatly. It is an example of exploiting a loophole.

The steward in today's Gospel knows he is to be dismissed from service, but he also knows that his master has been dishonest, as described above. What does he do? He decides to curry favour with those indebted to his master by asking them to pay back the real amount that is owed rather than the inflated amount the master had demanded. In this way the steward will make friends who will support him after his dismissal and the master will also look good as this act of generosity on the part of the steward will be understood to have come from the orders of the master. In this way the steward demonstrates great cunning - he also teaches us a lesson.

What is that lesson? Simply this: to use wisely what has been given to us, be it material wealth, gifts or talents, so that we will be welcomed into God's kingdom at the end of time, having been judged to be good stewards of what has been entrusted to us. It is appropriate that a steward appears as the central figure in this Sunday's Gospel because the concept of stewardship is really what is being highlighted by Jesus. We are stewards of everything we have and cannot lay claim to any of it for ourselves - it has been entrusted to us by God and as such all that we have is for the building of God's kingdom, and nothing else.

In light of this weekend's Gospel, let us not have the secular, worldly attitude of "I've earned everything I have so I can do with it what I like!" but rather, "What I have has been entrusted to me by God and so I will use it wisely to further God's mission. This is the purpose for which it was given to me."

Open Arms of St Patrick's Parish

Our Spring Bazaar on 14 September was a great success thanks to the involvement of so many St Patrick's parishioners and members of the Parramatta Community. What a wonderful community we have! So many rallied to make the Spring Bazaar a success and to support the Open Arms parish project to sponsor our refugee family to come to join our community. The family is expected to arrive in mid-November, if there are no hiccups in their travel arrangements, and we cannot wait to introduce them.

Thank you to Fr Robert, Fr Tom and Deacon David for their support of the Open Arms project and our fundraising efforts. Thank you to the more than 70 helpers, including 10 Parramatta Marist students, who worked tirelessly before, during and after the bazaar. It could not have taken place without your support and hard work. The joyous way in which you worked together as teams was wonderful to behold. We cannot mention you all here but you know who you are and we are very grateful to every one of you.

There are still a few little things to be finalised, but the Spring Bazaar achieved fundraising well above what we were hoping for, thanks to your support of our project, which is in line with the teaching of Jesus for us to love our neighbours. The reason the total raised was so high was that most of the food sold at the bazaar was donated (thank you, Adam, for organising many of these donations), the goods sold were donated by many of our parishioners, and the labour was freely given. The hire costs for the Gelato Bar and the Jumping Castle were covered by a donation. Our Hindu friends donated their delicious Indian food so that the funds raised could go to support our refugee family. The prizes in the ring toss were donated. Our face painters worked for free and donated the face paint. The plants were donated by a number of wonderful people with green thumbs. Our oranges came off Di's Mum's orange trees. Claire and her assistants made, donated and sold the preserves.

With so much donated or paid for by our wonderful supporters, we were able to raise just over \$8,000 on the day of the bazaar! This means that, thanks to all your support, we have funds available to help our refugee family settle into our Parramatta community. We will continue to update you on the progress of their arrival and their settlement when they do arrive. We ask for your continuing prayers in the coming months and for the 12 months during which we will sponsor our refugee family.

First Holy Communion Process

The Sacramental Team at St Patrick's Cathedral invites you to enrol your child in the Sacraments of Penance (Confession/Reconciliation) and First Eucharist. This will take place through a parish-based and family-centred process. That means that it is you who do the preparation with your child but we help you with this through a process of guided reflection.

In order to explain the way preparation takes place, you are invited to attend an Information Evening. This session will provide you with an opportunity to decide whether this is the right time for you to begin this with your child.

The Information Session will be held on Monday 20 October at 7:30pm at St Patrick's Cathedral Parish Hall, 1 Marist Pl, Parramatta.

Registration will be open from the following day, Tuesday 21 October. Details will be given about the process at the Information Session.

Enrolment will take place at the 9:30am Mass on Sunday 26 October.

To be eligible for preparation at this time your child must be 7 years of age by 01 July 2025 (this year). While this is the minimum age for children to join in

preparation it is important to note that there is no particular age for children who have been baptised as infants to begin preparation for Penance and First Eucharist, other than the minumum age noted above. It is important that you as parents discern if your child is ready and not be swaved by the fact that your child is now in a particular class at school, eg. Year Three.

22 September - St Maurice and the Theban Legion (d.287), Martyrs

Maurice (a name which means 'black') was a native of Thebes in Upper Egypt. When he was young, he was conscripted into the Roman army together with many youths of his area, and sent, for military service, to Switzerland. Before battle, the emperor ordered his soldiers to offer sacrifice to the Roman gods but the Theban Legion, headed by Maurice, refused. They remained steadfast even after being asked several times to apostatize, in loyalty to the emperor. Their allegiance to Christ earned them the crown of martyrdom in the year 287.
