Catholic guilt?

IT WAS ONLY last century that the phrase “catholic guilt” emerged in common parlance. What it referred to was the Church’s moral demands and its emphasis on repentance and the confession of sins. In teaching these things, perhaps the beauty and the consolation of this aspect of our faith was neglected for an over emphasis on all the bad things I have to avoid. Rather than teaching positively about what the Christian moral and spiritual life consisted in, there may have been, in some quarters, a more negative approach—thou shall not! In recent weeks, the readings from the lectionary have tended to focus on those things that we ought not to do, with an especial focus on the way we use our money and material wealth. Perhaps this focus on the bad things we need to avoid has left people leaving mass, their hearts not filled with that consolation and refreshment they sought but weighed down with a sense of “catholic guilt.”



Today’s readings continue the theme. The prophet Amos warns that those who are experiencing comfort and indulging themselves will be the first of the people to be exiled into a foreign land. In the gospel, Jesus’ parable about the rich man and Lazarus admonishes those that have likewise enjoyed their life at the expense of the poor that they will be exiled from the comforts of heaven when they die.

The scriptures speak strongly about these matters and can leave us feeling guilty. This can be a good thing. That sense of guilt is given to us in order to drive us to repentance. But if our conscience is clear with respect to the moral issues that have been emphasised lately, then I have no need to feel his way. What then can these readings offer?

We must not think that we cannot have comfort, that the good things of this life cannot under any circumstances be enjoyed. The Lord is not trying to scare us into heaven or make us feel guilty for the good life that we have received, which is after all, what he himself has provided for us. Today’s readings and those like them are meant to help us to realise that the way we live our lives now has consequences of what our life will be like in eternity; that once we die, we no longer have any say about how things will be. The rich man in the gospel is trying to talk his way out of the situation he has found himself in, but the point is that he had his chances to do good, but he neglected them. Opportunities to do well are given to us in every moment every day. That’s a very consoling thing, in the end. The Lord wants us in heaven with him and so he gives us all these opportunities to choose for it now. The invitation is there, it is up to us what we will do with it.


Cathedral Organ Recital – Monday 29th September @ 2.00pm

First Holy Communion Process

The Sacramental Team at St Patrick's Cathedral invites you to enrol your child in the Sacraments of Penance (Confession/Reconciliation). This will take place through a parish-based and family-centred process. That means that it is you who do the preparation with your child but we help you with this through a process of guided reflection.

In order to explain the way preparation takes place, you are invited to attend an Information Evening. This session will provide you with an opportunity to decide whether this is the right time for you to begin this with your child.

The Information Session will be held on **Monday 20 October** at 7:30pm at St Patrick's Cathedral Parish Hall, 1 Marist Pl, Parramatta.

Registration will be open from the following day, **Tuesday 21 October**. Details will be given about the process at the Information Session.

Enrolment will take place at the 9:30am Mass on **Sunday 26 October**.

To be eligible for preparation at this time your child must be 7 years of age by 01 July 2025 (this year). While this is the minimum age for children to join in preparation it is important to note that there is no particular age for children who have been baptised as infants to begin preparation for Penance and First Eucharist, other than the minimum age noted above. It is important that you as parents discern if your child is ready and not be swayed by the fact that your child is now in a particular class at school, eg. Year Three.

Saint of the Week

30 September - St Jerome (c.345 - 420), Priest, Doctor

Jerome was born in Strido, in Dalmatia. He studied in Rome and was baptised there. He was attracted by the ascetic life and travelled to the East, where he was (unwillingly) ordained a priest. He was recalled to Rome to act as secretary to Pope Damasus, but on the Pope's death he returned to the East, to Bethlehem, where (with the aid of St Paula and others) he founded a monastery, a hospice, and a school, and settled down to the most important work of his life, the translation of the Bible into Latin, a translation which, with some revisions, is still in use today. He wrote many works of his own, including letters and commentaries on Holy Scripture. When a time of troubles came upon the world, through barbarian invasions, and to the Church, through internal dissension, he helped the refugees and those in need. He died at Bethlehem.

Did You Know...?

...that the story in this weekend's Gospel, often referred to as “Dives and Lazarus”, is unique to Luke's Gospel ?

Luke's Gospel is littered with parables that are not to be found in Matthew or Mark, let alone John, which is a very different Gospel altogether. Stories and parables such as The Good Samaritan, The Prodigal Son, The Pharisee and the Tax Collector and The Persistent Widow are all unique to Luke, to name only a few. This is to say nothing of the detailed infancy narrative which is particular to Luke, though Matthew also presents a unique part of this story.


