Check your attitude...

LAST WEEK we were taught about the need to be persistent in prayer. This week is about the right **attitude** to bring to our prayer. To understand this better we need to consider our bosses. A boss is someone whose choices or decisions have a direct impact on our lives. We are always careful of our attitude towards our bosses, and the more important they are in our lives and the bigger impact they have on our lives the more attentive we are to our attitude towards them. I'll bet the people that work for Donald Trump are exceptionally careful about their attitude in dealing with him...



We need to keep this in mind when we listen to today's gospel because without understanding this point you could easily think there is something wrong with this gospel: on the one hand we have a good Pharisee who isn't sinful, who prays, fasts twice a week and gives generously to charity. And on the other hand, we have this tax collector who lives the exact opposite life – tax collectors were generally extortionists that got rich by extracting money from their own community, using Roman soldiers as their muscle. And yet in the gospel the Pharisee is the bad guy and the tax collector is the good guy. What is going on here? Well, the answer centres around the attitude they bring to prayer. The "good" Pharisee's prayer was all about himself, telling God how good he was. The tax collectors' prayer recognised fully his need of God and God's mercy. One was prideful, one was humble.

So, what is it that's so bad about pride and so great about humility? Pride is defined as a feeling of pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own achievements. Now the problem with this is the sense that "I did this." "Look what I have done." "How good am I?" If we look at situations through that lens, we are ignoring how much of our success was given to us from God. My gift came from God. My opportunity to use that gift came from God. All the factors that affect the outcome of a situation that are beyond my control, were impacted by God. So, there it is – the problem with pride is that it shows a huge lack of understanding and appreciation of the role God plays in every part of our lives. It gives us a distorted view of who we are and who God is.

Humility is not about making yourself a doormat, or not placing any value on yourself. True humility is to have an accurate, balanced view of who you are, relative to other people and in particular relative to God. St Paul, in the second reading, gives us a wonderful example: He tells us that he has "run the good race" and "fought the good fight" and he fully believes that he will receive the "crown of righteousness". But, he then tells us that everything important he did was done in the power of God, and that all glory should go to God.

This week let us take some time to meditate on God, on the immensity of His power, and on the immensity of His impact on our lives. When we understand that properly, we will bring the right attitude to our prayer, and "The prayer of the humble will pierce the clouds."

First Holy Communion Process -

The Sacramental Team at St Patrick's Cathedral invites you to enrol your child in the Sacraments of Penance (Confession/Reconciliation). This will take place through a parish-based and family-centred process. That means that it is you who do the preparation with your child but we help you with this through a process of guided reflection.

Registration is now open and will close 9.11.25 (day before first session).

Enrolment will take place at the 9:30am Mass on Sunday 26 October.

To be eligible for preparation at this time your child must be 7 years of age by 01 July 2025 (this year). While this is the minimum age for children to join in preparation it is important to note that there is no

particular age for children who have been baptised as infants to begin preparation for Penance and First Eucharist, other than the minumum age noted above. It is important that you as parents discern if your child is ready and not be swayed by the fact that your child is now in a particular class at school, eg. Year Three.

Saint of the Week

31 October - St Alfonso Rodriguez (1533 - 1617), Religious


Alfonso Rodriguez (1533-1617) was born in Segovia, Spain. His family played host to Saint Peter Faber, who prepared the young Alfonso for his First Communion. He left school at age 14 to help his widowed mother run the family wool business. At age twenty-seven, he married and had three children. Five years later, he found himself a widower with one surviving child, who died Soon after. He joined the Society of Jesus as a Brother at the age of thirty-eight. He spent the next forty-six years of his religious life as guest master and doorkeeper of the Jesuit college in Majorca, where he exercised a marvellous influence not only on the members of the college, but upon a great number of people who came to him for spiritual advice. He was a friend and advisor to Saint Peter Claver, encouraging him to go to the missions in South America. His daily routine, though ordinary, offered him opportunities for holiness of life: each time the bell rang, he looked at the door and envisioned that it was God who was standing outside. He was often heard to say "I'm just coming, Lord."


