"Were not all ten made clean?"

THIS WEEKEND we find Jesus travelling 'along the border between Samaria and Galilee.' It is here that he encounters ten lepers. It doesn't surprise us to witness Jesus curing the lepers after they acknowledge him as someone of significance ("Master!") and appeal for help ("Take pity on us.") What else would we expect Jesus to do? Jesus orders them to show themselves to the priests and only when they begin to obey this command do they find themselves cured and hence have the prospect of a new lease on life. As was always the case with someone cured of a serious illness in the time of



Jesus, the lepers now have to be declared clean by the religious authorities. Only then can they be reintegrated into society.

So off go the ten lepers to be declared clean and once again find life after years of miserable existence and social isolation. Then something unexpected happens: a lone leper returns and throws himself at the feet of Jesus, thanking him for his healing. At this point we hear the words which convey the true meaning of this incident, five words which would have shocked Jewish listeners to this Gospel passage: "The man was a Samaritan."

Jesus doesn't hesitate to emphasise this point quite heavily. He asks a couple of clearly rhetorical questions ("Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they?") and continues by highlighting the Samaritan's alien status ("It seems to me that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.") Jesus concludes by uttering yet another five-word sentence which would have impacted Jewish listeners in much the same way as the previous one: "Your faith has saved you." The idea that a Samaritan could experience salvation was contrary to the prevailing understanding that only the Jews, God's "chosen people", were entitled to this.

And so here is a message for us to take with us throughout the week ahead. In the Gospel it is the Samaritan outsider, the one who, by virtue of merely being a Samaritan, would have experienced prejudice even without leprosy, who recognises most readily the work of God in his life and responds with gratitude. How ready are we to acknowledge that God can work through others who are considered outsiders? Or are we all too willing to have others pander to our prejudices that deny the possibility that such people may be vehicles of God's grace for us? For example, people such as those of a different, or perhaps, no religion, people who are regularly marginalised because of their sexuality, disability, political viewpoints, an illness, race, and so on. Jesus makes it clear that God's grace is universal for those open to receiving it.

May we never be so certain of our own salvation that we risk losing it because of the uncharitable and unjust manner we treat others who we mistakenly beleive have little or no possibility of sharing in God's ineffable grace.



First Holy Communion Process

The Sacramental Team at St Patrick's Cathedral invites you to enrol your child in the Sacraments of Penance (Confession/Reconciliation). This will take place through a parish-based and family-centred process. That means that it is you who do the preparation with your child but we help you with this through a process of guided reflection.

In order to explain the way preparation takes place, you are invited to attend an Information Evening. This session will provide you with an opportunity to decide whether this is the right time for you to begin this with your child.

The Information Session will be held on **Monday 20 October** at 7:30pm at St Patrick's Cathedral Parish Hall, 1 Marist Pl, Parramatta.

Registration will be open from the following day, **Tuesday 21 October**. Details will be given about the process at the Information Session.

Enrolment will take place at the 9:30am Mass on Sunday 26 October.

To be eligible for preparation at this time your child must be 7 years of age by 01 July 2025 (this year). While this is the minimum age for children to join in

preparation it is important to note that there is no particular age for children who have been baptised as infants to begin preparation for Penance and First Eucharist, other than the minumum age noted above. It is important that you as parents discern if your child is ready and not be swayed by the fact that your child is now in a particular class at school, eg. Year Three.

Saint of the Week


17 October - St Ignatius of Antioch (d.107), Bishop, Martyr

He was the third bishop of Antioch, the first being St Peter until he moved to Rome, and the second being Evodius. He was arrested (some writers believe that he must have been denounced by a fellow-Christian), condemned to death, and transported to Rome to be thrown to the wild beasts in the arena. In one of his letters he describes the soldiers who were escorting him as being like "ten leopards, who when they are kindly treated only behave worse."

In the course of his journey he wrote seven letters to various churches, in which he dealt wisely and deeply with Christ, the organisation of the Church, and the Christian life. They are important documents for the early history of the Church, and they also reveal a deeply holy man who accepts his fate and begs the Christians in Rome not to try to deprive him of the crown of martyrdom.

He was martyred in 107 and his feast was already being celebrated on this day in fourthcentury Antioch.
