Time to take some responsibility

INCREASE OUR FAITH! This is the cry of the apostles in today's gospel and it's a normal and natural response of a person learning about what is expected of a disciple of Christ. Faith is a gift from God and we should always be making this prayer. When and how God responds to this prayer is in His hands but today's readings tell us about the aspects of our relationship with God that are in **our hands**.



In the first reading Habakkuk is lamenting the absence of God. We all have times when we feel God has abandoned us. Sometimes we just cannot feel His presence and sometimes a devastating event in one part (or many parts) of our life suggest that God has left us. At these times it comes down to a choice – despite everything I am now experiencing will I choose to believe, to be faithful? This is not something God has to do for us. Is it not for Him to prove Himself to us. There is a time where we simply have to choose to be faithful to Him.

In the second reading we have a very human Timothy, a disciple of Paul feeling very understandably scared. Jesus has been crucified, Paul is in prison, and being a disciple of Christ is a dangerous choice. Paul reminds him of the power he received when he was commissioned for ministry but then he tells him that it is Timothy's responsibility to fan into flames the gift that he was given. God gave the gift, but a gift only has value if we use it. It is our responsibility to live in the Spirit, the Spirit of power, of love, of self-control.

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches us that a disciple is called to a life of service. When a person serves another person, it is a natural thing to want to be thanked for that service, but that is not the way of a Christian disciple. When we serve, we are simply doing our duty. It is a privilege to serve. Serving is our act of love, and we love, because He loved first. Our service is an act of gratitude to Him, and unless we are asked to be an actual martyr, we will never match the love that He offered us.

In answer to the disciple's cry for increased faith, Jesus tells them that the issue is quality not quantity – with the smallest amount of true faith, a disciple can do extraordinary things. We have already been given everything that we need, through Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. We should always be praying for more faith, more courage, more wisdom, but in the midst of that, we should take up our own responsibilities. It is not for God to have to continually prove Himself to us, or to keep filling up our inadequacies. There is a time when it is up to us to show our gratitude, our courage, and our faithfulness to Him.

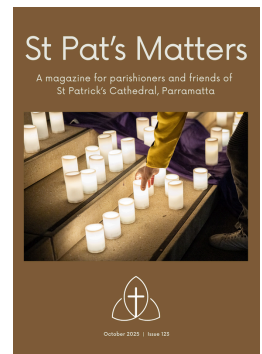

First Holy Communion Process

The Sacramental Team at St Patrick's Cathedral invites you to enrol your child in the Sacraments of Penance (Confession/Reconciliation). This will take place through a parish-based and family-centred process. That means that it is you who do the preparation with your child but we help you with this through a process of guided reflection.

In order to explain the way preparation takes place, you are invited to attend an Information Evening. This session will provide you with an opportunity to decide whether this is the right time for you to begin this with your child.

The Information Session will be held on **Monday 20 October** at 7:30pm at St Patrick's Cathedral Parish Hall, 1 Marist Pl, Parramatta.

Registration will be open from the following day, **Tuesday 21 October**. Details will be given about the process at the Information Session.

Enrolment will take place at the 9:30am Mass on **Sunday 26 October**.

To be eligible for preparation at this time your child must be 7 years of age by 01 July 2025 (this year). While this is the minimum age for children to join in preparation it is important to note that there is no particular age for children who have been baptised as infants to begin preparation for Penance and First Eucharist, other than the minimum age noted above. It is important that you as parents discern if your child is ready and not be swayed by the fact that your child is now in a particular class at school, eg. Year Three.

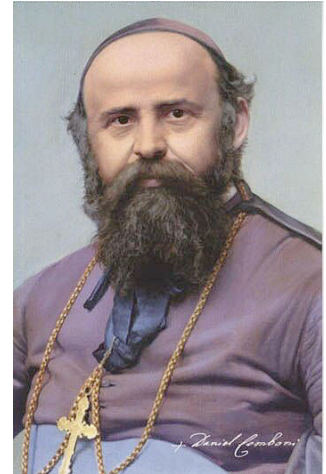

Saint of the Week

10 October - St Daniel Comboni (1831 - 1881), Bishop

Daniel Comboni was born in Italy in 1831. Early in life he felt the call to evangelize the peoples of Central Africa, who, at that time, were the poorest and most abandoned. He set off to Africa and established several missions. He presented an appeal to the Fathers of the first Vatican Council, founded two missionary Institutes and was given the responsibility of the whole Apostolic Vicariate of Central Africa. Faithful to his motto "Africa or death" and his plan for the salvation of Africa, he lived and worked for the success of the mission until he died in Khartoum (Sudan) on 10 October 1881, at the age of fifty.

Did You Know...?

...that silence is a crucial part of the Eucharistic celebration?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM 45) marks certain times that silence ought to be observed at Mass:

- at the act of penitence and again after the invitation to pray;
- at the conclusion of a reading and the homily;
- after communion.

Even before the celebration begins, silence is encouraged throughout the church so that everyone can dispose themselves appropriately for the sacred celebration.
