Christ our King

ISN'T IT INTERESTING that the Jewish authorities and the Roman soldiers are at complete odds with Christ about what would constitute power befitting a king? For those who condemned and crucified him, Jesus would prove his kingly authority by miraculously untethering himself from the nails and stepping down from the cross. "Let him save himself if he is the Christ," the Jewish leaders jeer, and they are backed up by the Roman soldiers who mock, "if you are the king of the Jews, save yourself." For these, the ability to avoid death, the sidestepping of that inevitable fate, would apparently be proof enough of someone who has an other-worldly power.



But there is Jesus, who claims for himself the authority of the Messiah, willingly surrendering his life in a shocking death.

In St Paul's wonderful hymn that we hear in his letter to the Colossians, Christ is proclaimed as one through whom and for whom and in whom *all things* are made. What this means is that Jesus has power over everything because all is his. In him there is nothing lacking. And this is true even while he was hanging there upon the cross. Because he has power over all, and he lacks nothing, he doesn't need to justify his existence by avoiding death. He can look at it in the face and submit to it, because even over this he has power. If he was to run away from it, that would be a demonstration of a lack of power in him, it would show that he feared it, was in some way subject to it.

Today, we proclaim Christ as King of the universe, because in dying and rising once more, he demonstrates that all things are subject to him. If he lives even though he has died, then there is nothing over which he does not rule. But he also demonstrates the nature of that authority. It isn't through "lording it over" people as he would say to his disciples, but through saving others, through coming to their aid and lifting them up in their need, and even giving them a share in his own royal privileges – "I promise, today you will be with me in paradise." How willingly, then, can we surrender our lives to him, who takes nothing from us, but indeed gives us everything.

On a personal note, I am very grateful to him for having given me so many good gifts in the two years I have spent here at St Patrick's. It is here, with you and for you, that I have first served as his priest and it has been a privilege to have done so. When St Peter asks the Lord what will come to him and his companions who have left everything to follow Jesus, Jesus responds by telling him that they will receive a hundredfold in return. You, the people of the parish of St Patrick's Cathedral, are certainly part of the hundredfold he is storing up for me. Although I won't be here anymore, I'm not going far and will count on your prayers as I seek to imitate our good King in serving his people wherever he leads me.





25 November - St Catherine of Alexandria (d.305), Virgin, Martyr



...that the Feast of Christ the King is a relatively recent addition to the Catholic liturgical calendar?

Wikipedia notes that this feast was “instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI for the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church. In 1970, its Roman Rite observance was moved from October to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time and thus to the end of the liturgical year. The earliest date on which the Feast of Christ the King can occur is 20 November and the latest is 26 November.”




