You Are God's Temple

TEMPLES PLAYED a central and significant role in the religious life of the people of Israel. The Jerusalem Temple was so central to the people that anything that happened to it affected all the other areas of life of the Israelites. Jeremiah was almost lynched for speaking against the Temple, the city and the people (Jer 7 and 26). The Temple signified the presence of God in their midst. It was their place of worship. The people believed that once they were able to find their way to the temple, they were safe from all dangers. The temple was used as a hiding place from external aggression. The first reading today speaks about the wholesomeness of the Temple and all that pass through it (Ezek 47). Humans, animals and plants find wholeness through their association with the temple.



However, the Temple assumed a different meaning and significance in the New Testament. St Paul reminds the Corinthians that the Temple of the Lord was more than the physical edifice. The people themselves are God's Temple and they must keep it holy (1Cor 3:9). While the physical structure of the church should be respected and maintained, it is the spiritual structure, that is our body, that needs more respect and dignity.

Jesus showed in the gospel his displeasure at what the people were turning the Jerusalem Temple into - a place of commerce and corruption (John 2:13-22). The import of this action was almost lost as the people thought that all began and ended with the physical structure. Jesus made it clear, though indirectly, that he was actually referring to his own body, and by extension, our own bodies as the Temple of God.

The feast of today, the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, has been celebrated in Rome since the 12th century. It was later extended to the whole Roman Rite as a sign of unity and love for the See of Peter. The Lateran Basilica is described as "the mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World".

We join in this feast today to show our solidarity and love towards the mother church as a sign of unity. Let us not be like the people of Jeremiah's time who were accused of hypocrisy. They lived a double life because whenever they were in the Temple, they appeared as holy people. However, their conduct outside the Temple was completely different. This was the reason God was angry with them and threatened to punish them. Let there be no discrepancy between our lives both in and outside the church. This is because it is not just the physical edifice that is the house of God, we ourselves are the dwelling place where God chooses to be. Let us also not be like the Jews of Jesus' day who turned the temple into a market place with no respect and decorum. May we continue to play our part in building up the Temple of God here on earth. May we also be assisted by the special grace of God to preserve our own bodies from the poison of sin so as to share in the beatific vision on the last day.


Saint of the Week

15 November - St Albert the Great (1206 - 1280), Bishop

He was born at Lauingen on the Danube, in Germany, and studied at Padua and Paris before entering the Dominican Order. He taught in a number of places including the University of Paris, where St Thomas Aquinas studied under him.

He was one of the greatest philosophers of the Middle Ages, coming at the beginning of the great flowering that came with the rediscovery of the works of Aristotle. He had a great interest in science and astronomy and his learning gave him the title, as a Doctor of the Church, of Doctor Universalis, the "Universal Doctor."

In 1260 the Pope made him Bishop of Regensburg, a post that he held for three years before resigning it. He made great efforts to secure peace between people and between cities. He died at Cologne in 1280.

Did You Know...?

...that the Lateran Basilica, more properly known as The Archbasilica of the Most Holy Saviour and Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist, is the Cathedral Church of Rome?

Just as St Patrick's Cathedral is the Cathedral Church for the Diocese of Parramatta, so is the Lateran Basilica the Cathedral for the Diocese of Rome. It is this Basilica which is the cathedral of the Pope in his capacity as Bishop of Rome, not St Peter's Basilica as many would (understandably) assume. Though founded in the year 324, the new structure's interior was renovated in the late 17th century, and its façade was completed in 1735.




