## The End is Nigh!

"THE END IS NIGH!" When I was young (a very long time ago...) you sometimes came across a person carrying a sandwich board with those words written on it. It never really goes away. These days we will have hundreds, maybe even thousands, of YouTube videos describing why we are in the "end of times." This fascination stretches right back to Jesus's time. There will have been plenty of Christ's disciples that will have expected that the end of the world and the final judgement was going to happen in their lifetime, and in fairness to them, there were certain scriptures that could easily have been interpreted that way. Jesus' death and resurrection could have been seen as a likely sign of the end coming. The Jewish temple was so integral to the Jewish faith that its destruction would have been so devastating that it could easily have been understood as the beginning of the end. In some of St Paul's letters he had to warn the disciples not to be preoccupied by all this, and yet at this time every year (the last three Sundays before Advent) our Church encourages us to reflect on it. Ordinarily, last week's scriptures would have begun to set the scene but because the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica fell last Sunday we missed out on those scriptures so in some respect we are jumping in in the middle and the scriptures for this week might seem a little jarring.



In the gospel Jesus appears to be speaking about the destruction of the Temple and at one level He is, but at the same time He is speaking about the end of times. The people ask Him, as people always do: "When will this happen, and what will the signs be that it is about to happen?" Jesus answers them and tells them there will be signs – wars and famines and huge disruptions in the earth and in the sky, but He goes on to tell them that before all of this, they themselves will face great challenges, and this is the really important part. Jesus wanted us all to know that being a Christian would bring tremendous challenge, from the outside – kings, governors (our society) and from the inside – our own families and friends. Jesus tells us that while there will be tremendous turmoil there are two things that we must keep in mind: The first is that He will walk with us and give us what we need in the midst of all this, and the second is, what will matter is how we conduct ourselves in the face of these challenges – "your endurance will win you your lives."

Contemplating the end of times and the challenges and the traumas that will lead up to it might seem a bit morbid, but there are very good reasons for us to take some time every year to think about it. People want to know the signs so they can prepare their lives for it. What our Church is reminding us that it will always be a challenge being a Christian and that each of us will come to the end of our time – it doesn't really matter if it is singly or all together. Our entire life should be lived with that in mind, and it's good to be reminded of this.







## Saint of the Week

19 November - St Raphael Kalinowski (1835 - 1907), Priest

Raphael Kalinowski was born to Polish parents in the city of Wilno in 1835. Poland and Lithuania were at that time occupied by the Prussian, Austrian and Russian Empires.

He served in the Imperial Russian Army, but when the Poles rose against their oppressors in 1863 he joined them as Minister of War. Arrested by the Russians, he was condemned in 1864 to ten years of forced labour in Siberia. In 1877, he became a Discalced Carmelite and was ordained a priest in 1882. He contributed greatly to the restoration of many Discalced Carmelite communities in Poland that had previously been suppressed under Russian occupation. His life was distinguished by zeal for Church unity and by his unflagging devotion to his ministry as a confessor and spiritual director. He died in Wadowice, Austria-Hungary, in 1907. The town was later to become famous as the birthplace of Pope John Paul II.

## Did You Know...?

**...that our readings towards the end of the liturgical year have an “eschatological” leaning, speaking of the end times?**

The word “eschatology” is a Greek word which means “concerning the eschaton”, the eschaton being the end of time. Our readings at Mass around this time of the year leading to Advent, from both the Hebrew and Christian scriptures, focus on fantastic imagery as well as some sober words from Jesus affirming that life as we know it will end and he, Jesus, will return for the judgement. It is important to note that though many have given specific dates, now passed, for the eschaton and the return of Jesus, they have failed, and Jesus himself says that no one except the Father knows when these things will take place (Matthew 24:36).




