Let the Word of God Injure us and Heal us

TODAY IS THE Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The general theme of today's liturgy is humility which cuts across all the readings at Mass. However, since today is also the Sunday of the Word of God in Australia, it is expedient that we reflect on the significance and importance of the word of God in the life of the Christian. At creation, God created the heavens and the earth by the power of his word. He created everything *ex nihilo*, that is, out of nothing (Gen. 1 & 2). This word through which all was created is the same word which became flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary as attested by John in his writings (John 1:1-18, 1John 1:1ff). At creation, the three persons of the Blessed Trinity were present. God the Father spoke his Word and the Spirit hovered over the surface of the deep. We see in this the synergy that existed among the persons of the Trinity.



One of the characteristics of the Trinity is humility which is well spoken about today in our readings. Zephaniah encourages the people of his day to seek the Lord in humility so that they might find shelter in the day of the anger of the Lord. It is only the humble who would be able to find peace and abundance in the day of trouble. Paul also emphasises this point in the second reading by saying that it is God who exalts the humble. Human beings have nothing to boast about because everything achieved is a gift from God. Hence he says: if anyone wants to boast, let him boast about the Lord.

The beatitudes occupy central stage in the gospel passage. Here, Jesus praises the humble and lowly of heart. Those who find themselves at the fringes of the society are encouraged and comforted. The beatitudes challenge us on the practice of our Christian faith which is often at odds with the way of the world. The Christian is expected to be guided and ruled by the word of God. The way of the Christian is quite different from the way of the world. Hence Jesus says that they are in the world but do not belong to the world (John 17).

The word of God has the capacity to transform us only if we dispose ourselves accordingly. For it is the word of God in human language (2 Pet. 1:19-21). We cannot be impervious and close minded and expect the word of God to penetrate us (2 Tim. 3:16). Whenever we hear the word of God, we should accept it in humility and allow it to wound us, break us, reprove us, challenge us, interrogate us and remold us (Jam. 1:22-25). More often than not, we try to conceal some aspects of our lives from the word of God because of the pains of transformation we do not want to bear. Whenever the word of God is being read or the homily is being delivered, some have already made up their minds on what to accept and what to resist. We should not be afraid of being hit by the word of God for it also has a healing and redeeming remedy. Rather, let the word of God injure us and at the same time be our source of healing.

Saint of the Week

03 February - St Ansgar (d.865), Bishop

Ansgar was born in Amiens at the start of the ninth century and educated at the monastery of Corbie in Picardy. He went as a missionary to Denmark in 826 but had little success; but in Sweden he did better. He was elected Bishop of Hamburg (this was at that time a missionary see dedicated to evangelising the North) and appointed papal legate to Denmark and Sweden by Pope Gregory IV. He encountered huge difficulties in his work of evangelisation but he overcame them. He died in Bremen on 03 February 865.

He is known as “the apostle of the North.” His diaries are an important documentary source for early Scandinavian history.

Did You Know...?

...that the Beatitudes, which form this Sunday’s Gospel extract, mark the beginning of the great Sermon on the Mount?

The Beatitudes are something of a prelude to Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount, which make up chapters 5 - 7 of Matthew’s Gospel. The Beatitudes are broad in nature but they are supplemented by what Jesus goes on to preach in more detail immediately afterwards. We have something of the same structure, though much shorter, in Luke’s Gospel, though there the sermon is delivered on a plain and occupies less than one chapter (chapter 6).
