Salt and Light

THIS WEEK in our Gospel, we continue reading St Matthew's the Sermon on the Mount. Not only is this the '*greatest sermon ever preached*', but it is a sort of manifesto for those who are to be citizens of the Kingdom of the New Heaven and New Earth, the New Jerusalem. Last week, we saw our blessed Lord ascend the mount like a new Moses, calling out and presiding over his people, flipping the script on this fallen world, introducing the Christian paradox of life in the beatitudes: blessed are the poor in spirit, mourners, meek, hungry, merciful, pure, peacemakers, and the persecuted. Lest we think the citizens of this new Christian world order are merely aloof passive spectators who are simply victims of this fallen world, Christ tells us today that we are "salt of the earth" and "light to the world".



Against modern medical advice which desires we reduce our salt intake, Christ employs this symbol as a defining feature of the Christian. So precious was the common table condiment, that Roman Soldiers who were "worth their salt" were paid in this commodity, from which we get the world "salary". In the temple, salt was an essential component of the temple cult, the cereal offering, consisting not of Coco Pops and Weet-Bix, but normally of bread and wine, would be mixed with salt. This *salt of the covenant* would also be used to preserve the meat offerings.

Christ immediately pairs the image of salt, with the symbol often employed by Christ, that of Light, the very first work of creation. Matthew's Gospel will later employ this symbol of Christ's disciples in the parable of the ten virgins, in which only the wise virgins bring forward the oil of charity in their good works to be lit. These two dimensions provide complementary insight into the mystery Christ preaches today. Although, like salt, we are to preserve the New Covenant, we are not merely to remain static; much like light which floods the darkness of this world, we are to add something, to give flavor to this world. Unlike natural salt, the disciple can lose their saltiness and become useless, just as light can be extinguished.

This week, our parish is announcing an exciting new initiative, directly responding to Christ's call today. In partnership with Parramatta Mission, St Patrick's Cathedral will be undertaking a trial to provide respite in shelter to those suffering homelessness in our community. These are not people who are remote or removed from us, but literally the neighbors on our doorstep, living across the road, and often participating in the prayer of our Cathedral parish. This initiative, preserved in the heart of our Tradition in the corporal works of mercy, enriches our mission in adding the Christian flavor of Charity to the hungry, and the warmth Christ's light to the homeless in Parramatta.

Although only being here a short time, I have witnessed the warmth and evangelical flare of this parish and am confident that this is an opportunity that will be undertaken with zeal and enthusiasm, prompting a great and generous response characteristic of this Christian community, shedding light on that fact that we Parra Catholic are "worth our salt".

Saint of the Week

13 February - Blessed Jordan of Saxony (c.1185 - 1237), Priest

Blessed Jordan was born at Burgberg, Westphalia, around the year 1185. While studying in Paris he was attracted to the Dominican Order by Blessed Reginald and received the habit from him in 1220. On the death of Saint Dominic the friars elected him Master of the Order. For fifteen years he ministered to his brothers and sisters by his preaching, his letters, his edition of the Constitutions, his frequent visitations and the example of his life. More than one thousand novices were attracted to the Order during the tenure of his office. He directed Blessed Diana and her community in the way of perfection and governed all his subjects with gentleness and kindness. His love for Mary, the Mother of God, expressed itself by his decree that the Salve Regina was to be sung after compline. Blessed Jordan was shipwrecked and drowned on 13 February 1237.

Did You Know...?

...that salt, a key theme of this weekend’s gospel, was commonly added to water when it was blessed?

Though the practice is not so common today, salt was regularly added to blessed water in accordance with the older liturgical books. This practice was to acknowledge the protective powers of salt and so their power to drive out evil, a reminder of the exorcism rite which is a part of every baptism. Salt was also commonly used at the reconsecration of altars and in the baptism ritual.






You are the Salt and Light!

Jesus says we are the salt of the earth. Have you ever tasted food that wasn't salty enough? It can taste pretty bland. But do you notice when food has the right amount of salt? Usually we don't think about it. It's kind of hiding in the food and making it taste good. Jesus wants us to be like the "salt" in the world, with the goodness and truth that He gives us.

Jesus also says that we are the light of the world. Can you imagine a completely dark world: no sun or lights or anything? It would be pretty scary. You'd never know what was happening or where you were going. That's what the world can be like for people who don't have the light of God's truth. It's our job to bring the truth to the world so that everyone can see that God loves them.


