“Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here..”

HAVE YOU ever had an experience of God that has overwhelmed you? It might have been simply a moment of intense intimacy and warmth that came to you in prayer, perhaps an insight into scripture that you know could have come only from the Holy Spirit, maybe a revelation of the sheer reality of God when you have received the Eucharist, or perhaps even an experience of the divine that grasped you in spending time with family or friends.

The point is that whilst these experiences are very real and clearly significant for us, these times of blessing are generally fleeting. We would love to sustain these times and bask forever in that intimacy and reality of God, but it is not to be. Of course, this desire to extend times of enjoyment applies equally to the secular world. No one wants a good time to end!



Peter, the most impetuous of the apostles, is one example of someone wanting to extend a time of divine intimacy. In this Sunday's Gospel, the famous story of the Transfiguration, Peter, along with the other two apostles closest to Jesus, James and John, witnesses the transfiguration of Jesus and the appearance of Moses and Elijah, and wants to spend more time on the mountain with them – to the point of offering to build a camp! But it is not to be so: without being given any reply, Peter and the others hear the voice of the Father affirming Jesus' identity and commanding them to listen to him. Following this, Jesus tells them not to be afraid, and they all descend the mountain to carry on their journey to Jerusalem.

Some scripture scholars understand the enigmatic event of the Transfiguration as Jesus' way of affirming his identity and giving encouragement to the apostles at a crucial time. But that is all it is. The group cannot dwell on the mountain because there is work to be done, the work of salvation. And that work can take place only in Jerusalem.

During this season of Lent, making a more concerted effort in our prayer life, we may experience God in a special way, perhaps in a way unknown before now. It is natural that we want to capture and live in that moment, but we cannot do that if we want to be truly Christian. Our faith demands that we use whatever encouragement and nourishment we get from God for the mission, the mission to make God known to others. Our faith is not meant to be something we keep to ourselves like a security blanket but rather something that demands to be shared, even if that involves some suffering on our part, as it did for Jesus.

So, as we continue the early stages of the Lenten pilgrimage, let us give thanks for opportunities we are given to draw closer to God and, by extension, God's people. But let us also see these times as opportunities to continue the mission we were given in baptism, the mission to bring others into intimacy with God by living as Jesus calls us to – lives marked by love, mercy, compassion, justice and an inner joy.

Let us resist the temptation to try and orchestrate constant intimacy with God. After all, when, please God, we arrive in heaven, that intimacy will never end!

07 March - Saints Perpetua and Felicity (d. 203), Martyrs


They were martyred at Carthage in 203 during the persecution of Septimius Severus. With so many martyrs of the third and fourth centuries we have to say “they were martyred but nothing else is known about them.” That is not the case here. We have a detailed contemporary account of their arrest, trial, sufferings and martyrdom, written partly by the saints themselves and partly by an eye-witness. Devotion to them spread rapidly and they are mentioned in the Roman Canon of the Mass.
