"...that they may all be one."

USUALLY WHEN I use a quotation as the title of a bulletin piece, it is taken from one of the readings of the Mass of the Sunday concerned, most often the Gospel. This is not the case this weekend. Try as you might, the quotation that forms the title of this piece is found much later in John's Gospel than the Gospel that we hear this Sunday on the feast of The Most Holy Trinity.

On this feast day there are myriad perspectives open for emphasis as a means of deepening our faith and assisting our mission. One of these perspectives worthy of our attention is that of unity, hence the title of this little piece. These words of Jesus, "that they may all be one", taken from his great High Priestly Prayer in chapter 17 of John's gospel, speak of the unity of God, a God who we know to be trinitarian in nature. The intimacy of which Jesus speaks of his relationship with his Father is quite moving; "As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us..." (John 17:21)

The unity of which Jesus speaks is not something we aspire to simply to make us feel good. This unity is an essential part of our witness as Christians in a world that is so fragmented and unstable. And there is no better example for us of intimacy and unity than the Trinity – three persons, one God. "Because of that unity the Father is wholly in the Son and wholly in the Holy Spirit; the Son is wholly in the Father and wholly in the Holy Spirit; the Holy Spirit is wholly in the Father and wholly in the Son." (Catechism, n.255) It is of interest to note that Pope Leo chose for his motto *In Illo uno unum* ("In the One we are one.")

This unity will not come about through our own efforts. Like anything we do that conforms us more like Christ, it is the Holy Spirit which is the chief agent of radical change. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "It is the Holy Spirit, dwelling in those who believe and pervading and ruling over the entire Church, who brings about that wonderful communion of the faithful and joins them together so intimately in Christ that he is the principle of the Church's unity." (n. 813)

Hard on the heels of the Solemnity of Pentecost, it is fitting that we should focus on the role of the Holy Spirit in our unity as a Christian people, to say nothing of the other works of the Spirit in inspiring and animating us, and so on. Let us understand however, that in asking the Spirit to unify us, we are not asking it to make us uniform. It is in our very diversity that our strength lies. Bearing in mind that we are given the Spirit for the purpose of spreading the Gospel, diversity enables us to best spread the Good News to a greater range of people, in a variety of circumstances, to the best effect.

As we celebrate the fortieth anniversary of the erection of the Diocese of Parramatta, may we recommit ourselves to being a unified people, aspiring to the intimacy of the Trinity, with a focus that is solely on using our gifts for the building of God's kingdom here in western Sydney and the Blue Mountains.

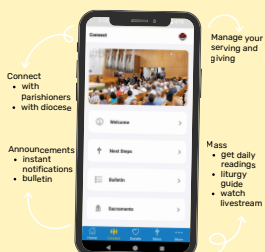

Reverencing the altar at the Cathedral

Regular Cathedral parishioners know that it is customary to acknowledge the altar when arriving and leaving the liturgy. In our Cathedral configuration the altar is placed in the heart of the Cathedral so that it becomes the central focus of the celebration. (In fact, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal informs that the altar is the principal symbol of Christ in a Church.) Because our seating is in choir formation it means that many people arriving for Mass do not walk in front of the altar, but enter the building either from the cloister or the Victoria Road entrance, and then take their seat in the pews. I would like to suggest that wherever you choose to sit, that before you enter your pew, that you direct your attention to the altar and then bow before entering the pew, not genuflect. At the end of Mass, I am suggesting that when the celebrant and the other ministers are leaving the Cathedral, and form up in front of the altar for the final reverence, that everyone in the Cathedral bows at the same time as the ministers. Thus, the altar will be properly revered both at the beginning and the end of the liturgy by all in attendance.

Saint of the Week

01 June - St Justin (c.100 - 165), Martyr

He was born at the beginning of the second century in Nablus, in Samaria, of a pagan Greek family. He was an earnest seeker after truth, and studied many systems of philosophy before being led, through Platonism, to Christianity. While remaining a layman, he accepted the duty of making the truth known, and travelled from place to place proclaiming the gospel. In 151 he travelled from Ephesus to Rome, where he opened a school of philosophy and wrote defences and expositions of Christianity, which have survived to this day and are the earliest known writings of their kind. In the persecution of 165, in the reign of the emperor Marcus Aurelius, he was denounced as a Christian, arrested and beheaded.

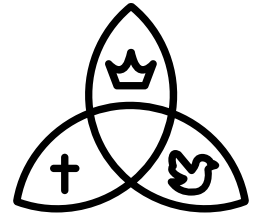
