“Cry out with joy to the Lord... Come before Him, singing for joy.”

WE HEAR TODAY from Psalm 99 (100), traditionally titled the “Psalm for the Todah (thanksgiving)” or, in Greek, the “eucharistia psalm”. In our worship, we are instructed to “come before Him singing for joy”. In recent decades, the Church has placed considerable pastoral emphasis on fostering a deeper understanding of the place of sacred music in the liturgy. Music can sometimes be neglected or regarded as excessive or merely ornamental, a nice optional extra. The Second Vatican Council, however, echoed the Church's ancient tradition in teaching that sacred music “forms a necessary or integral part of the solemn liturgy” (SC, 112). Far from merely being an embellishment, it is more akin to the baking soda in baked goods, helping our worship and praise to rise.



Music seems to be a ubiquitous phenomenon of humanity, our knee-jerk reaction whenever we try to approach the divine. “When man comes into contact with God, mere speech is not enough. Areas of his existence are awakened that spontaneously turn into song.” (Benedict XVI, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*). If we look to almost any religion since the beginnings of civilisation, we find that music has always played a major role in worship and in the communication of and to the divine, whether through chants, folk music, or ballads, as witnessed even in the Church's most primitive and primary hymn book, the Psalms. Even our Blessed Mother could do little else but sing a hymn of praise in the glorious hymn “The Magnificat” after she conceived Christ. However, even in secular settings, such as formal civil ceremonies, graduations, and sporting events, music plays a major role in enhancing the experience and fostering a unique expression of community spirit and identity.

The Second Vatican Council teaches that “music... is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than any other art” (SC, 122). This essential element of the liturgy assists us in:

1. Highlighting the communal aspect of the liturgy by raising our hearts and voices in union with one another in worship, thereby fostering unity and belonging;
2. Promoting full, conscious, and active participation through the above, while also helping us to discern and experience the degree of solemnity attached to a particular occasion - for example, the difference between a weekday Mass and a Sunday Mass, or between Lent and Easter;
3. Elevating us through the beauty and style of liturgical music within the liturgical context, drawing us away from the profane and toward the divine, toward Him and beyond ourselves.

We are very blessed and privileged in this Cathedral parish to boast some of the finest most beautiful sacred music in the country. The Cathedral and her choir's prayerful dedication ensures the Church's rich musical tradition is not only preserved but brought to life. The oft-quoted proverb states: “he who sings well pray twice”, and truly our musicians work hard to ensure that our prayers are magnified.

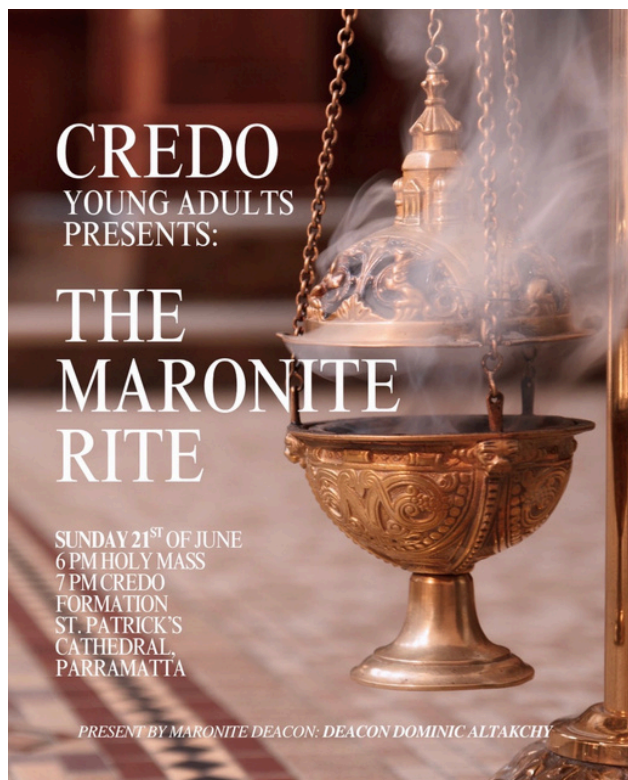

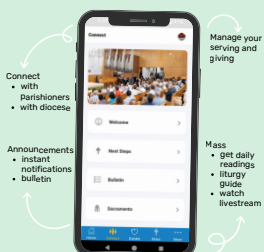
Bring your family and friends, and stay after Mass to enjoy a wonderful morning together while supporting our young people through Credo Ministry.

Open Arms of St Patrick's Parish

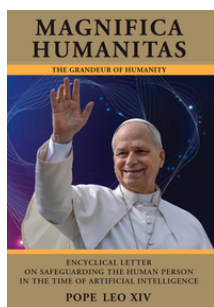

Saint of the Week

19 June - St Romuald (c.951 - 1027), Abbot

Romuald joined a Benedictine monastery but made himself unpopular there by trying to get the lax monks to mend their ways and so, with the permission of his abbot, became a wandering hermit. In a constant fight against the degenerate monasteries of the day, he founded hermitages and monasteries where a life of prayerful solitude could be truly lived. The monastery at Camaldoli, which he founded and where he remained as abbot for a number of years, became the first house of an order of hermits which still exists. But Romuald took to his wanderings once more, and died in a monastery he himself had founded at Val di Castro – as he wished, alone in his cell.

Did You Know...?

...that the lists of apostles in the Gospels, such as the one we have in this Sunday’s Gospel, have some subtle differences, but John has the biggest differences?

John’s Gospel does not name John, the brother of James, but mentions one of the “sons of Zebedee” and “the disciple whom Jesus loved.” In John’s Gospel too, no mention is made of Matthew, James the Younger or Simon the Zealot. Interestingly, John does not give a formal list of the Twelve as the Synoptic Gospels do.
