“Do not be afraid.”

“THE ONLY thing we have to fear is fear itself.”

No, these are not the words of Jesus but rather of United States President Franklin D Roosevelt, spoken back in 1933 during the Great Depression. He was urging people not to succumb to fear during a time of economic and social turmoil, pointing out that doing so usually stops people from acting to deal with a situation and bring about positive change. Fear can freeze us, stop us dead in our tracks, just like someone who is being rushed at by a wild animal - paralysis, caused by fear, will almost certainly result in a tasty meal for the animal concerned!



In this Sunday's Gospel we encounter Jesus encouraging his disciples, opening with the words found in the title above: “Do not be afraid.” The Twelve would surely have needed to hear these words, bearing in mind that only ten verses earlier Jesus had warned the Twelve that he was sending them out “like sheep into the midst of wolves” (10:16), and that they would be flogged in the synagogues (10:17). Following Jesus' words in today's Gospel, he says that he has come not to bring peace to the world, but a sword (10:34). Jesus then describes the divisive outcome of his message, pitting a man against his father, daughter against mother, and so on (10:35-36). Essentially, Jesus doesn't make any attempt to sugarcoat the response that his message of love will evoke in many who hear it, especially those in positions of power.

Jesus challenges not only the disciples he was speaking to at the time, but us as well. Like the Twelve, we have the been handed the mission to spread the Good News to those we encounter. Like the Twelve, too, we can expect to get a negative response from time to time, maybe frequently. While is it unlikely that we will suffer persecution to the extent that tradition tells us all but one of the apostles did, death, we can expect that our efforts to show Christ's love will meet at the very least indifference, often ridicule, perhaps even violence to varying degrees.

Knowing this, Jesus' words have a particular resonance for us. If we consider the possibility of a negative response to our manner of living from those we encounter, fear may result in us seeking to minimise, or even eliminate, the extent to which we open our hearts to the Holy Spirit, the very force which inspires and animates our faith in action.

Let us take to heart the promise of Jesus to be with us “to the end of time” (Matt 28:20), giving us the confidence and reassurance we need to be bold in our proclamation of the Gospel, however that looks for each of us and for our community. Fear paralyses us, minimises our Gospel response, and may move us towards indifference to our faith or, even worse, its rejection. Essentially, succumbing to fear poses the danger of making us indistinguishable from those who don't share our faith, both in word and deed.

“Do not be afraid.” A timeless message we should take to heart most especially at this time.

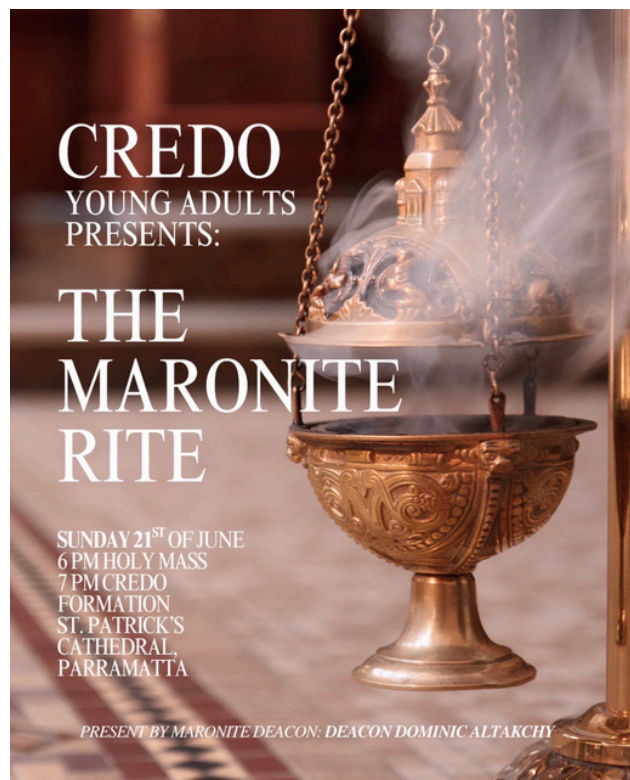

We will be taking up an extra collection after the homily for this purpose.

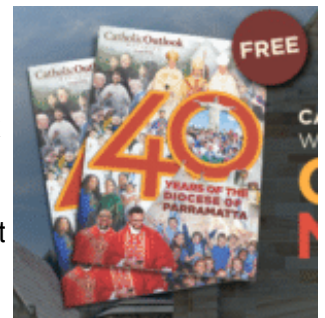
Children's Liturgy Update

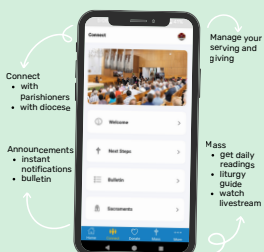

Saint of the Week

23 June - St Etheldreda (c.638 - 679), Abbess

She was born in Suffolk in the first quarter of the 7th century. She was married twice but remained a virgin, and in 672 left her second husband, the King of Northumbria, to become a nun. The following year she founded a monastery of men and women, which she ruled as abbess, on the site of what is now Ely cathedral. She died there in 679. She was the most venerated of the women saints of Anglo-Saxon England, renowned for her dedication to a life of chastity and for the austerity of the regime she imposed on herself in her later years.
