Preferring Christ to all others

RECENTLY, a person that I am very fond of asked me a moral question out of the blue. I hadn't been expecting it and I was caught off-guard. What clicked into gear was my pastoral nature. I gave them an answer that reflected my affection for them, and I knew almost immediately that I had given the wrong answer. I knew I had preferred my relationship with that person over my relationship with God. That is exactly the kind of conflict that Jesus is talking about in today's Gospel.



Satan, our enemy, is subtle and manipulative. For people trying to be good Christians, he doesn't always tempt us with things that are obviously bad, he will often try to compromise us by splitting our loyalties. He will put us in a situation where we are forced to choose between someone we love – a father, mother, son, daughter, or a good friend, and God. Just as he did in my situation, he will supply us with lovely arguments that encourage us to choose the person, and that is exactly what Jesus is warning us against today. You see even though these choices might appear to be pastoral acts of love, they are not. They are the exact opposite. There are truths which our faith teaches us, and compromising these truths, is not in fact an act of love, it is an act of sin. Sin is anything that damages our relationship with God. The truth of a situation can be inconvenient, it can be hard or difficult, but the truth is the truth, and the truth has been given to us by God as an act of love, to help us to live good and fruitful lives. When our loyalties appear to be divided, we need to look a lot more closely at what is happening. Giving someone the easy answer, the answer they want to hear, ultimately will do them a damage. The truth is a reality, and if we deny or try to avoid a reality, our situation only ever gets worse.

As I said, I knew pretty much immediately that I had done the wrong thing, so I moved as quickly as I could to organise a second conversation. This conversation will involve dealing with the truth of the situation. It will be no less pastoral. We are called to be properly pastoral, not in what we say, but in how we say it. Hard truths must be delivered with great love and gentleness.

In the second reading St Paul talks about how in baptism we go into the tomb with Christ in order to be reborn into this wonderful new life with Him. This, "going into the tomb", means that we are called to die to this life: we are called to give up all the things that this life promotes as great, including things that can appear on the surface as objectively good, things like family loyalties. The rewards of Christianity are immense – grace, peace, love, a fruitful meaningful life, and ultimately eternal life. But we cannot receive the rewards of discipleship without accepting the cost of discipleship. We must take up our cross, even if that cross means creating difficulties in relationships that matter to us. Ultimately, the reward for us, and often even for the person we are dealing with, will be immensely greater than the price we pay today.



We will be taking up an extra collection after the homily for this purpose.

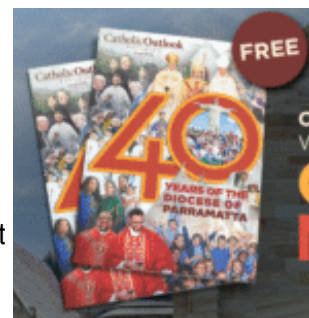
Children's Liturgy Update

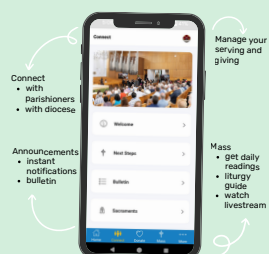

Pilgrimage to Turkey in 2027 - Fr Robert

I am looking to see if there is any interest amongst parishioners for a pilgrimage to Turkey in **October next year (2027)**. This pilgrimage, titled "In the Footsteps of St Paul", is a comprehensive tour of key sites associated with St Paul and the early Church. I led a similar tour back in 2014 which was very positively received by those who travelled with me. Among other places, we will visit Cappadocia, some of the sites of church communities mentioned in the Book of Revelation, Kusadasi, Ephesus (including Mary's House), and Gallipoli, a special place for Australians. Of course, many other places are on the agenda. At this stage, the tour is planned for **08 - 21 October**, with an optional extension to Greece also possible. The Turkey pilgrimage is expected to cost around \$7800 per person, including flights, hotels, meals and tours with a guide, etc.

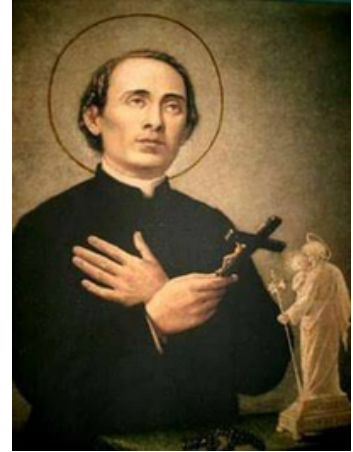

He taught the catechism to children and gave away all the money he had to help the poor. He also found a special apostolate among the British soldiers and sailors who were using the island as a base, teaching the catechism to those who were interested and making many converts.
