The Parable of the Sower

WE COME this Sunday to a point close to the middle of the Gospel of Matthew, the beginning of a series of seven parables of Jesus about the kingdom of heaven that take us through almost all chapter thirteen of the Gospel. As most of the parables are quite short, we will hear all seven of these parables over this weekend and the next two Sundays.

This weekend we hear just one parable, a longer one, the Parable of the Sower, with the bonus of an explanation by Jesus. This parable appears also in the Gospels of Mark (4:1-9) and Luke (8:4-8), with varying degrees of detail. It is only in Matthew however, that we have Jesus explain to the disciples, and so to us, the meaning of the parable.

Moving to the First Reading today, which always relates to the Sunday Gospel, the Prophet maintains that the word that emanates from the mouth of God "does not return to me [God] empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do." This sets us up nicely for the words of Jesus, who speaks of seed and it bearing huge crops.

But before speaking of the seed that bears such crops, Jesus speaks of failure: seed being eaten by birds before it has had a chance to bear shoots, other seed which quickly dies after a spurt of growth, and seed which gets choked by other plants. This being so, and perhaps this being the case for most of the seed that has been sown, how then does what God has brought to the earth return having done its work, as per the promise of the Prophet?

This is where we come into the picture. It is our responsibility, and privilege, to be the good soil that produces abundant crops. And Jesus tells us how we need to be disposed in order to be such soil. In his explanation of the parable, Jesus states that the disciple who is "good soil" is the one who "hears the word and understands it." This challenges us to predispose ourselves through whatever the Church gifts us for our use, that will help ensure that we have not only the ability to hear the voice of God but also the ability to understand what God is saying to us, and then the strength and courage to put such words into practice. It is this final step that is the "crop-bearing" part of the equation that sees God's word return to God "succeeding in what it was sent to do."

As we hear the other six parables in this part of Matthew's Gospel over the next two Sundays, we will note that they are prefaced by the words, "The kingdom of heaven is like...", or something similar. This is the kingdom that we are called to make manifest through our words and deeds each day, imperfect as it may be in comparison to the kingdom that Christ will institute at the end of time. Our eyes and ears have been blessed as Christians, not so that we can feel special and superior to others, but so that we can help others to know Christ and so help them on the path to salvation.

Let us be, individually and corporately, good soil to yield an abundant harvest!

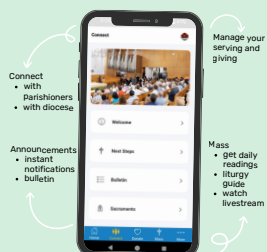

Saint of the Week

14 July - St Kateri Tekakwitha (1656 - 1680), Virgin

Known as the "Lily of the Mohawks" and the "Geneviève of New France," she was born in the Mohawk fortress of Ossemenon in what is now New York State, the daughter of a Mohawk warrior and a Catholic Algonquin woman whom he had saved from captivity at the hands of the Iroquois. When she was about four, smallpox killed her parents and her brother and left her scarred and with impaired eyesight. She was adopted by her uncle, the chief of the Turtle clan, and had many offers of marriage. She received some knowledge of Christianity from Jesuit missionaries when she was 11, and she determined to live the life not only of a Christian but of a Christian virgin: a heroic determination at the time. She was baptised when she was 20 and eventually, to escape persecution and death threats, she fled to an established Christian community at Kahnawake in what is now Québec. She advanced in union with God, with bodily mortification and intense prayer, and died at the age of 24. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II on 22 June 1980 and canonised by Pope Benedict XVI on 21 October 2012.

Did You Know...?

...that the Parable of the Sower, like many parables, is found in all three synoptic Gospels?

The synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) often feature the same parables but with slight variations. Apart from the Parable of the Sower, the three synoptic Gospels also feature common parables about the mustard seed, new wine in old wineskins, the lamp under a bushel, the tenants, and the lesson of the figtree.
