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## Seeking Forgiveness

I DO NOT often single out a particular race or nationality but today I would like you to join me in celebrating... the Irish! Today's scriptures speak a lot about sin and judgement and it is in this area that we as Catholics owe a great debt to a group of Irish monks from the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> centuries.

The power to forgive sins was given to the Apostles by Christ. "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." (John 20:23) In the early Christian Church there was confession, penance, reconciliation, but it was quite different to what we have today. Serious sins would have to be confessed publicly, penance could stretch for years, and it was a widespread practice that these serious confessions could only happen once in a lifetime. This was one of the reasons that many people that wanted to become Christians held off getting baptised until later in life – the fear of becoming a Christian and committing a serious sin was daunting because of the severe consequences.

In the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> centuries, the Irish monks revolutionised the sacrament. They developed a practice of private confession, even for serious sins, along with a very comprehensive guide - offering particular penances to proportionally match particular sins. Most importantly, this practice was repeatable - it reflected the journey of faith over a lifetime, with human failings and reconciliation being an ongoing part of a Christian's striving for holiness. In essence they created the practice that we would recognise today.

In today's gospel Jesus once again speaks in parables. Parables are very helpful for understanding concepts within our faith, and Jesus uses them to great effect, but we must remember that parables are also limited - they don't capture the fullness of every idea, and we should be very glad of that today. Today's gospel speaks about the wheat and the darnel growing together until the harvest. This, as Christ tells us, refers to the righteous and the unrighteous living together within the kingdom of God, until the time of judgement. Now if the parable captured the whole story, people would be either righteous - in right relationship with God, or unrighteous. That would not be good news, because all of us are unrighteous at different times in our lives. It is only through the beautiful gift of the sacrament of Reconciliation, that we who have sinned, can get back into right relationship with God, and His Church.

This is what God wants. He wants us always to come back into right relationship with Him. In the first reading, we are assured that God "is mild in judgement", He "governs us with great lenience", and after sin He "will grant repentance." The psalmist tells us that the Lord is "good and forgiving."

It is for us then, to seek that forgiveness, through the beautiful gift of the sacrament of Reconciliation. And there is no sin big or bad enough that Jesus will not forgive. The only truly disastrous mistake we can make is in not seeking Reconciliation.

Today then, let us celebrate that we are not locked into being unrighteous just because we have sinned; let us celebrate the great gift of Reconciliation that Jesus has given us, through our Church; and maybe let us celebrate the Irish monks that revolutionised how that sacrament could be practised.

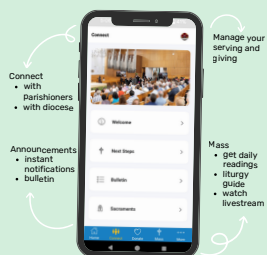

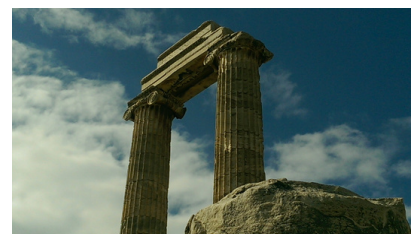

## Pilgrimage to Turkey in 2027 - Fr Robert

I am looking to see if there is any interest amongst parishioners for a pilgrimage to Turkey in **October next year (2027)**. This pilgrimage, titled "In the Footsteps of St Paul", is a comprehensive tour of key sites associated with St Paul and the early Church. I led a similar tour back in 2014 which was very positively received by those who travelled with me. Among other places, we will visit Cappadocia, some of the sites of church communities mentioned in the Book of Revelation, Kusadasi, Ephesus (including Mary's House), and Gallipoli, a special place for Australians. Of course, many other places are on the agenda. At this stage, the tour is planned for **08 - 21 October**, with an optional extension to Greece also possible. The Turkey pilgrimage is expected to cost around \$7800 per person, including flights, hotels, meals and tours with a guide, etc.

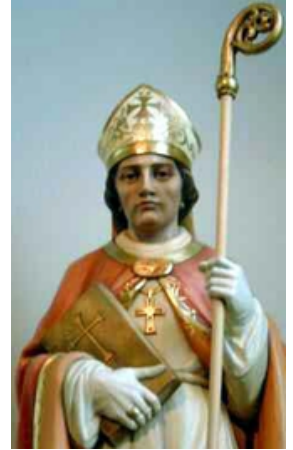
## Saint of the Week

20 July - St Thorlac Thorhallsson (1133 - 1193), Bishop

Thorlak Thorhallsson was born in 1133 at Hlíðarendi in the see of Skálholt in southern Iceland. He was ordained a deacon before he was fifteen and a priest at the age of eighteen. He studied abroad at Paris with the Victorines and then studied canon law at Lincoln. He returned to Iceland in 1165 and founded a monastery of Canons Regular at Þykkvabær. There he devoted himself to a strictly religious life, refusing to marry (many other Icelandic priests were married) and devoting himself to reciting the Our Father, the Creed, and a hymn, as well as fifty Psalms.

Thorlak was consecrated bishop of Skálholt by Augustine of Nidaros and worked to regulate the Augustinian Rule in Iceland, as well as to eradicate simony, lay patronage, and clerical incontinency.

He died on 23 December 1193 and after having been informally venerated as a saint for many centuries he was officially canonised by Pope John Paul II, who named him patron saint of Iceland.

### Did You Know...?

**...that there are seven petitions in the Lord's Prayer which we pray each time we attend Mass, and on other occasions?**
