The Treasure of the Kingdom

IN OUR GOSPEL today, we come to the end of Christ's third major discourse in the thirteenth chapter of St. Matthew, the Parables of the Kingdom. The two short parables follow a similar pattern: something of value is found, its value surpasses all else they possess, and everything is sacrificed in order to possess it. Like King Solomon in our first reading, we are challenged today to consider what it is we truly value and desire.



In some respects, it might seem quite simple to identify what we truly value. Many of us might respond with answers like God, faith, family, and friends. These may seem like the "correct" answers, but I wonder if, like Solomon, given the opportunity to have whatever our hearts desire, we would be so pious as to overlook greater comfort, material wealth, or worldly power in favour of higher, intangible goods.

Although a man of privilege, Solomon, in a sense, sacrificed, at least the possibility of other goods for the priceless treasure of wisdom. However, his life also serves as evidence of a devastating fall from grace when this highest good of wisdom was demoted to a tool for furthering lesser worldly pursuits.

A curious element of today's first parable, the hidden treasure in the field, is that its discoverer could have simply stolen the treasure without the burden of selling his possessions to buy the seemingly superfluous land. However, the treasure of the Kingdom is unique. It cannot be acquired unjustly, and it must come at a cost. Its value lies not in possessing it alongside other things of varying worth but in the poverty of everything else being sacrificed or offered up for that true treasure, which is beyond the net value of all else we could possess.

Most of us Catholics coming to church on Sunday are much like the men in today's parables. We have already discovered the hidden treasure in the field. Like the merchant who can distinguish a bad pearl from a great one, we have been catechised enough to objectively recognise what is of most value. This great treasure is uncovered each time we celebrate Holy Mass because the true treasure of the Kingdom is Wisdom Himself, offered in the Eucharistic sacrifice, waiting for us in the treasure chest of the tabernacle. To possess this heavenly treasure, we must firstly truly seek and desire it, not just "know about it", and respond to Christ's directive to give all we have in charity, take up the cross of sacrifice, and follow Him.

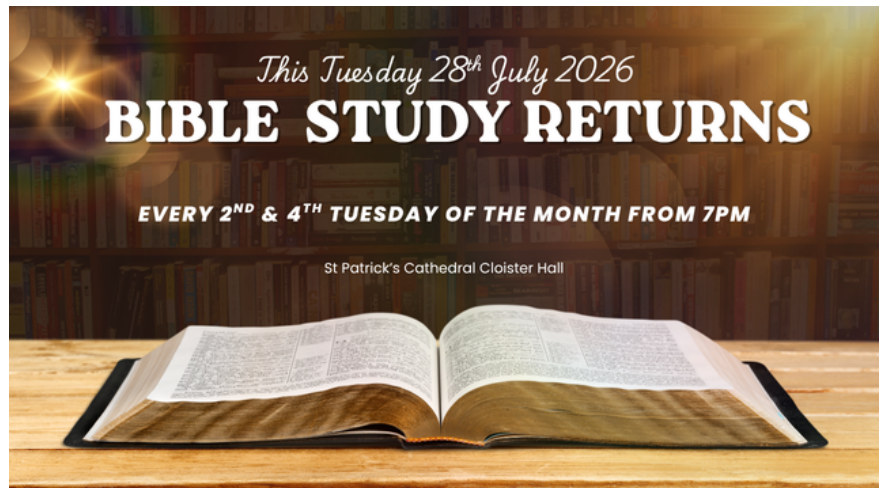

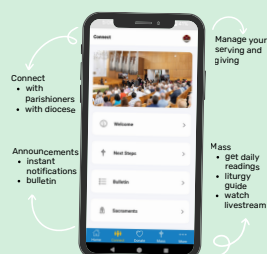

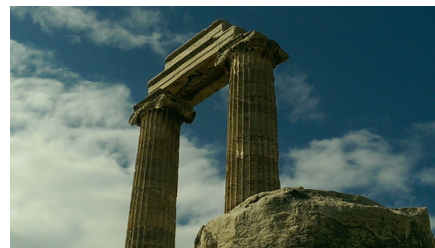

Saint of the Week

30 July - St Justin de Jacobis (1800 - 1860), Bishop

Justin was born in Italy in 1800. He joined the Vincentians (Lazarists) and later was sent to Abyssinia (Ethiopia-Eritrea) as a missionary. He studied the local language and culture and slowly developed a special love for the Abyssinian traditions which he used in his missionary ministry. Made bishop in 1849, De Jacobis worked hard for the formation of the Catholic Church, establishing a seminary together with Blessed Ghebre Michael, and ordaining several priests. He died in Eritrea on 31 July 1860. His missionary methodology, rooted in inculturation, is both a legacy and a challenge for missionaries today.

Did You Know...?

...that the Church asks that babies are baptised soon after birth?

The Code of Canon Law (n.867) states that "parents are obliged to see that their infants are baptised within the first few weeks." Of course, this is not always possible but it underlines the importance placed by the Church on the sacrament. The Catechism states (n.1250): "The Church and the parents would deny a child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God were they not to confer Baptism shortly after birth." Most commonly these days in the West, babies are baptised after a few months, once domestic life has settled down!
