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Jesus is interested in our integral wellbeing

ON THIS 18th Sunday of the year, God gives us some words of consolation and assurance that He is more than enough to take care of all our needs. Human needs could be classified as spiritual and temporal. Our spiritual needs are borne from our need for God whom we are called upon to worship in spirit and truth (John 4:24). This is carried out through various religious practices and virtuous living according to the commandments of God. Our temporal needs, on the other hand, refer to our material necessities of life. This includes food, shelter, good health, security and general sustenance. The readings today underscore the fact that both the spiritual and temporal needs of human beings are not mutually exclusive. Rather, they are intertwined. The liturgy of today envisages a complete and whole human person who is healthy both in body and soul.



The prophet Isaiah tells us in the First Reading to honour the invitation of God as He prepares a banquet for all. This was after their return from their exile in Babylon. The prophet assures them that God is ready to provide for their sustenance. The participation at this banquet is at no cost. In other words, it is gratuitous. The only requirement is that the people must be hungry and thirsty. They do not have to worry about satisfying these basic necessities of life on their own because their great provider is always there for them. St. Paul echoes this point in the Second Reading that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ. No matter the circumstances in which we find ourselves, God is always enough for us. He says: "For I am certain of this: neither death nor life, no angel, no prince, nothing that exists, nothing still to come, not any power, or height or depth, nor any created thing, can come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom. 8:38-39).

Jesus lives out this teaching in the gospel passage today by feeding the multitude with both spiritual and material food. He begins by first teaching them at length and then going ahead to feed them materially. This is to establish the fact that there should be no dichotomy between the spiritual and the temporal. The human person should be seen and treated as a whole person whose integral wellbeing is essential. In our world today, there seems to be a gulf between worship and life. This should not be the case. When the disciples suggested that the people should go away to look for food by themselves, Jesus said: "There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves" (Matt. 14:16). We must be interested not only in the spiritual needs of one another but also in the material needs of those unable to look after themselves. (Matt. 25:31-46; Acts 2:42-47; Jam. 2:14-26).

As Christians who have been called to follow the lifestyle of our Master, we must not be superficial in our faith. Our faith must translate into concrete actions on a daily basis. Our love and generosity must be extended to all irrespective of faith or colour. As the response to the psalm says: "You open wide your hand, O Lord; you grant our desires". We must, therefore, be like our Father who is ever ready to satisfy the needs of his people, even those who do not worship him. Let us be concerned about what happens to one another since that is what Jesus would have us do.

Parish Pastoral Council Update

At our July meeting the council welcomed three newly appointed members, previously announced by Fr Robert, bringing the group back to full strength for the remainder of its term ending mid-2027. Michael Lilley, Cheyl Linus and Gaulbert Pais will bring a variety of perspectives to the PPC.

Highlights from the matters we discussed:

- The Homeless Memorial brought together people experiencing homelessness along with a wide range of religious and community leaders to reflect and remember.
- Preparations for the overnight shelter are proceeding, while taking longer than anyone expected.
- The development of parish groups for young people continues, and the Diocese will shortly be launching World Youth Day 2027 which some of our youth want to attend.
- The appeal at masses for people to join our St Vincent de Paul Conference was very successful and the generosity of parishioners is once again appreciated.
- Several parishioners volunteered to represent the parish at the synodality gatherings the Diocese has been hosting.
- New readers, servers and extraordinary ministers of communion have come on board recently and another team is helping to look after the sacred vessels.
- Planning for the Spring Fair is underway, and more helpers will be needed for that.
- Almost all volunteers have completed their safeguarding training.
- The Charter governing relationships between the Cathedral and the Chancery has been finalised.
- Preparation for Confirmations in September has begun.

The PPC and the parish Finance Committee will be having a social gathering followed by a day of retreat and planning next week so that we will be moving forward together. In preparation we are analysing change and growth in the parish over the past two years, looking for alignment with our vision and mission statement. We welcome your feedback and prayerful support. Homeless Shelter Trial Update

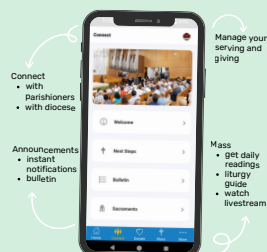
Dear Parishioners,

There has been a lot of activity post Easter to plan the overnight shelter trial. We have met with Council planning staff and understand we need to lodge a development application. Work is in progress to gather the documents needed to support the DA. Parramatta Police have been briefed on the trial and are supportive. Uniting NSW, who employ two social workers based at Parramatta Mission, are progressing an agreement with the parish to do the assessments and referrals for the trial. There has been engagement with the Chancery regarding insurance and risk assessment. Mattresses, linen and blankets have been donated. Volunteers have been identified from the cathedral parish, other parishes and other faith communities. The trial will be considered as a parish ministry. Volunteer onboarding will start in August. We hope to meet with Orange Sky during August to explore their support for the trial with mobile showers and laundry washing. Bishop Vincent has also been given an update briefing on the trial during July. The current overnight shelters interstate are running their winter programs. We are in contact with them to learn from their operational experiences and apply this knowledge to the upcoming trial.

Please continue to keep the shelter trial, all those involved in planning and delivering the trial, plus our friends experiencing homelessness, in your prayers.

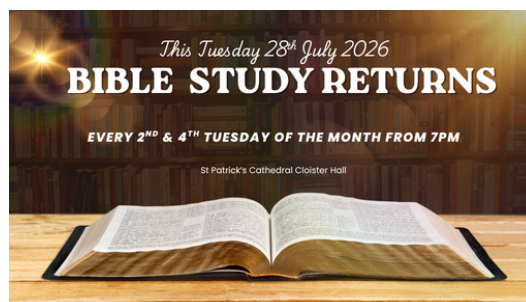

Saint of the Week

07 August - St Cajetan (1480 - 1547), Priest

He was born in Vicenza and became a priest at the age of 36. He worked hard for the poor and the sick and for the reform of the Church; with this last aim in mind, he founded a congregation of secular priests which became known as the Theatines. These had three functions: preaching, the administration of the sacraments, and the celebration of the liturgy.

He encouraged the growth of pawn-shops as a means of helping the poor out of temporary financial difficulties and keeping them out of the hands of usurers. His congregation also cared for incurable syphilitics.

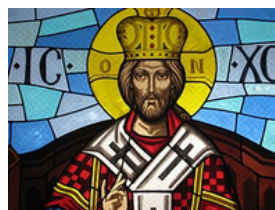

Did You Know...?

...that there is more than one Catholic Church?

Typically, when most people think of the Catholic Church they think of the Roman Catholic (or Latin Rite) Church, and understandably so, since most Catholics belong to this Rite. There are many other Catholic churches however, all of whom are in full communion with Rome and so recognise the Pope as their earthly head. Each of these churches has



its own manner of celebrating Mass and the sacraments, yet we all share the same fundamental doctrine. A few examples are the Maronite, Melkite, Chaldean and Syro-Malabar churches, all of whom have Bishops in Australia.



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
