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"The way you think is not God's way..."

HOW QUICKLY things can change. Last Sunday we witnessed the famous scene of Peter declaring Jesus to be "...the Christ, the Son of the living God." Finally, it seems, Peter understands the true nature of Jesus as God incarnate. Jesus then bestows upon Peter the gift of the keys of the kingdom of heaven and all the benefits that flow from that, most notably the ability to forgive sins and thus reconcile people with God. All seems well at the conclusion of last Sunday's Gospel.

But this positivity is short-lived. This Sunday's gospel, following on immediately from that of last Sunday, sees a drastic turn-around on the part of Peter. He recognises Jesus as the Messiah one moment, Jesus calls him Satan the next! The reason for this remarkable change of events is Peter's failure to understand what being the Messiah means. He acknowledges Jesus to be the Messiah but refuses to understand that the Messiah should suffer like a normal human being. Jesus' response, after calling Peter Satan, is to accuse him of thinking in a human way, not in a Godly one.

It is tempting to think that Peter will very quickly learn his lesson after this rebuke from the man he loves so dearly, yet we hear that all the disciples were greatly distressed when Jesus next foretells his death in this same Gospel (17:22-23). Peter, it seems, is not alone in failing to come to terms with the true nature of Jesus as the Anointed One.

The key to understanding Jesus as God incarnate lies, as Jesus makes clear to Peter, in thinking in a different way. If Peter was a worthy recipient of Jesus' words in this regard, how much more so are we?

We are called, with the aid of the Spirit, to look at everything through a divine lens. If we don't, then our manner of being is no different to others who are of a different faith, or no faith at all. Our faith will be identified with what we do that is explicitly religious, such as attending Mass or praying, and little or nothing else. This is not to say that we are any better than anyone else, but we are certainly called, as Christians, to be different to others. And we will only act differently to others if we perceive people and situations in a different way.

Let us then pray that the Spirit will work in us, allowing us to perceive what others see as ordinary and pedestrian, or as negative and unfavourable, through eyes that can see God at work in such situations. It is not difficult for anyone with even the smallest hint of faith to see God at work in extraordinary, positive events, but only one who is truly intimate with God will see God at work in ordinary daily events and, more importantly, in times of suffering and hardship. If even Peter struggled with this, it is hardly surprising that we do too.

But when we do make that breakthrough, when we do see God at work everywhere and in everyone, not only is our life made brighter and more meaningful, but we will help enable others to start the same journey towards the God of truth and love.

Put simply, we will be evangelising, the very thing we are called to do as disciples, like Peter, of the One who died and rose again.

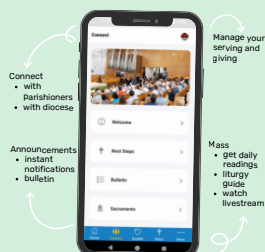

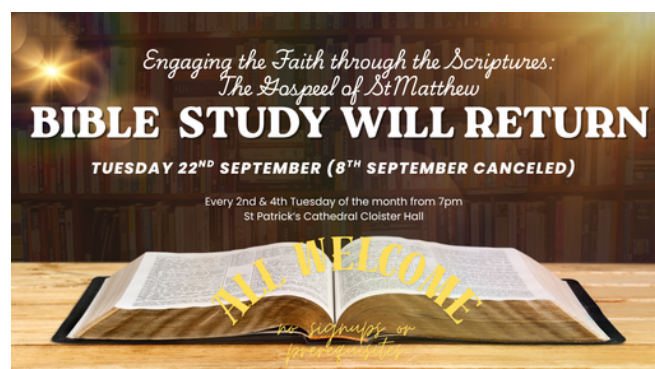
We Need Your Help!

01 September - St Giles (c.650 - c.710)

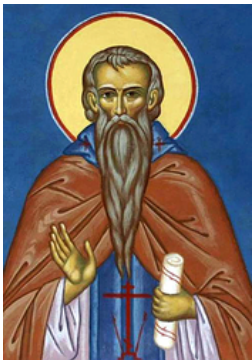
Giles was a Greek Christian hermit saint from Athens. He settled in Gaul to escape his high reputation in Greece, and became for many years a hermit in a forest near Nîmes. He spent many years in solitude there but eventually founded a monastery. This monastery, at Saint-Gilles-du-Gard, became a place of pilgrimage and a stop on the road that led from Arles to Santiago de Compostela, the pilgrim Way of St James.

His life and personality became a magnet for pious legends, behind which a coherent biography is sometimes hard to discern. He is the patron saint of Edinburgh.
