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To Live is Christ and to Die is Gain

THIS SUNDAY, in our second reading, we begin our short pilgrimage through St Paul's Letter to the Philippians. Composed towards the end of St Paul's life, while he is imprisoned and awaiting his trial, it is known as a "captivity letter", forming part of his final testimony. Naturally, St Paul's mind is oriented towards those "last things", with his final tribulation in death and martyrdom looming large, as the Cross completely eclipses his circumstances.



St Paul meditates today on that age-old question: what is the purpose of life? For many, when facing life or death, our natural inkling might be to cling to our life, and yet St Paul writes: "To live is Christ and to die is gain". The conundrum for St Paul is not so much whether to live or die; in fact, whether his earthly life is extended or not is merely a consequence of something greater. We have a front-row seat as St Paul grapples to discern and discover what God's plan for him is now.

I imagine that if many of us today were having a showdown with Death, we understandably mightn't be as magnanimous as St Paul. His detachment from this life is not simply the frustrated disillusionment of someone "throwing in the towel", as though life is insubstantial, but of someone who has already had a taste of the fullness of life as a citizen of heaven and is confident in his hope for the things to come.

There is something striking and captivating about St Paul's bold impassivity or serenity, no matter what life throws at him. Living, for him, is his enduring in Christ as he labours in the vineyard of the Lord, whereas death is a transitional intensifying of the communion he already has in Christ.

St Paul's witness to us is the gradual self-emptying of ourselves before our Almighty God. Although we are tempted or inclined to cling onto the things of this world, if we want to conquer the trials of the world and prove victorious, it cannot come from our own strength alone, because eventually, it will wane and fail. If we come to God, exposing our poverty and with empty hands, it will be He who will arm us with the weapons and tools we need to "fight the good fight" and stand on the firm foundations of Christ: the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the readiness of the Gospel of peace on our feet to lead us on His path.

We are blessed to welcome the Major Pilgrim Relic of St Carlo Acutis to our parish from **Monday 28 September to Wednesday 30 September**.

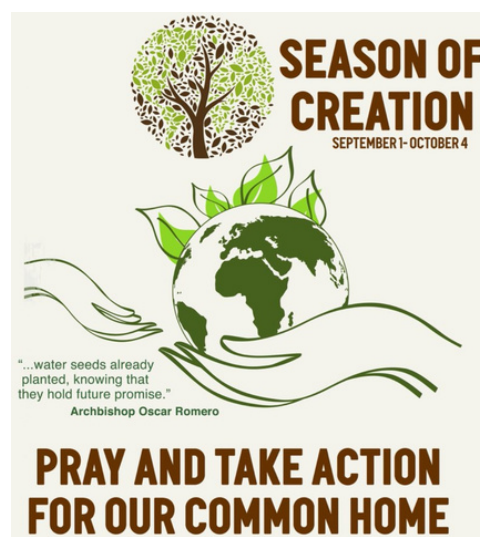
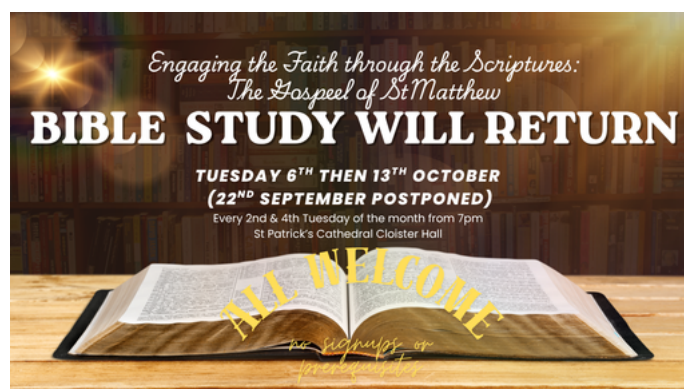

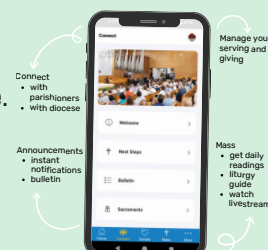

Saints of the Week

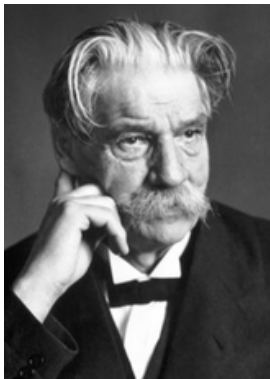
22 September - **St Maurice and the Theban Legion** (d. 287), Martyrs

Maurice (a name which means 'black') was a native of Thebes in Upper Egypt. When he was young, he was conscripted into the Roman army together with many youths of his area, and sent, for military service, to Switzerland. Before battle, the emperor ordered his soldiers to offer sacrifice to the Roman gods but the Theban Legion, headed by Maurice, refused. They remained steadfast even after being asked several times to apostatize, in loyalty to the emperor. Their allegiance to Christ earned them the crown of martyrdom in the year 287.
