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Actions, Words, and Heart

IT'S SO FRUSTRATING, isn't it, when someone says they'll do something and then they don't do it? "Sure, I'll put out the bins," but then they don't put them out, and you have full bins hanging around all week. "Yes, I'll do my assignment this weekend, and I won't leave it till the last minute" and then they don't, and everyone is under pressure and stress because its being done at the last minute... These are just childish examples but the situation gets a lot worse when the issues become more serious. Our society only works well if people are true to their word. We have to be able to trust people's word or else things just start to fall apart. In the ideal world we need consistency: people's actions need to match their words. It looks as though we are long past that in our society. We are in what they have called the "Post Truth Era" – people don't even expect the truth any more. Every day politicians are caught out in lies and there are no real consequences.



So, if we can't rely on people's words, what can we rely on? Well, I guess we simply have to watch what they do. In the end it is actions that count.

What about us, then? Are we true to our words, or are we like all these people around us?

When we say the Our Father, we make a couple of statements – how do our actions match up against those statements? "Thy kingdom come" – Are we actively working towards God's kingdom coming? Are we making our homes, our communities, our parish a place where kingdom values of love, mercy, charity, and justice are clear? "Thy will be done" – Have we been seeking God's will for our lives? And as God presents His will to us, have we been ready to embrace that path, regardless of the cost? And what about this one: "as we forgive those who trespass against us" – Are there people in our lives for whom we carry a grudge? Are we estranged from people because we cannot bring ourselves to forgive them? Do we go around with a super sensitive attitude, waiting for people to put a step wrong so that we can take offence?

In today's gospel Jesus berates the chief priests and the elders. They all appeared very pious in their prayers, but their actions didn't follow through. The tax collectors and prostitutes, on the other hand, had listened to John the Baptist's call to conversion and had actually repented. It was their actions that mattered.

We must be careful to ensure that our words are reflected in our actions. Do we think God is impressed by our words? Do we think He is unaware of our lack of action? No, God knows, God sees, and no amount of lovely prayerful words will save us, if our actions have not matched what we said we would do.

This gospel is such Good News for me, and for any other sinners out there. How ever we may have been in the past, if today, like the first son, we have a change of heart, and if our actions demonstrate that change of heart is real, then God will welcome us home.

Children must be 7 years of age by 01 July 2026 to be eligible. Parents are encouraged to prayerfully discern whether their child is ready to begin preparation.

We are blessed to welcome the Major Pilgrim Relic of St Carlo Acutis to our parish from **Monday 28 September to Wednesday 30 September**.

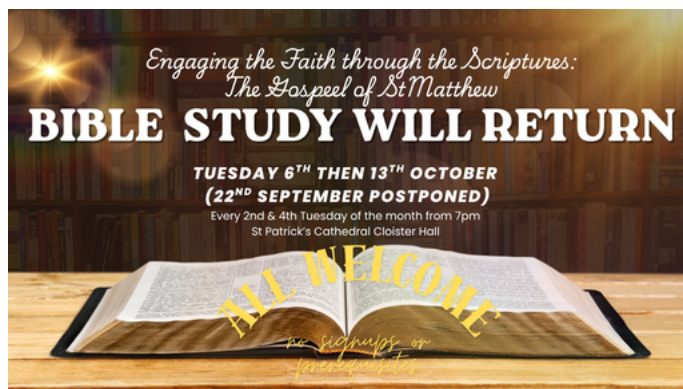

Daylight Saving and Public Holiday

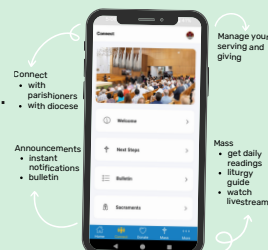

A River City Christmas

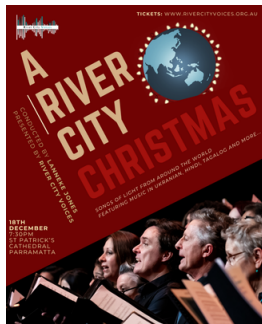
Songs of light from around the world, featuring music in Ukranian, Hindi, Tagalog and more...

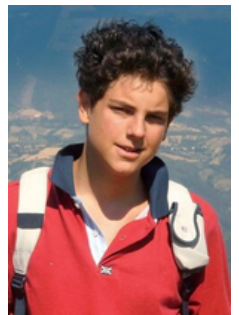

According to Wikipedia, Carlo Acutis was born on 03 May 1991 in London as the eldest child of Italian parents Andrea Acutis and Antonia Salzano, members of wealthy Italian families. His grand-father was businessman Carlo Giuseppe Maria Acutis.
